## Poole welcomes Alchemy: Artefacts Reimagined inspired by objects found in museums across the region

On 1 February 2020, a unique exhibition opens at Poole Museum featuring an array of artworks inspired by fascinating objects found in museums across Dorset and Wiltshire.

Alchemy is the work of contemporary artist, Ann-Marie James. She was invited to delve into the collections of four museums in Wessex and choose an object from each that would inspire a collection of gold and white artworks to be displayed at each of the museums alongside the objects that inspired them. Her techniques included painting, gilding, printmaking, using rubber stamps and even shaving designs into a rug.

From Poole Museum, Ann-Marie selected a Roman glass head, a tiny carved piece which is believed to have originally hung from a wine glass. The glass head is thought to depict Silenus, a companion of Bacchus, the Roman god of wine.

December 7: Members' Christmas Party Councillor Mark Howell, Cabinet Member for Regeneration and Culture, said: "It is fascinating to see how Ann-Marie has looked at the museum objects from a different perspective and created modern works inspired by the incredible craftsmanship of our ancestors. We are delighted to be hosting this exhibition in Poole and hope it will encourage people to look at objects differently and find their own inspiration."

Ann-Marie James added: "I've long been fascinated by the epic poem 'Metamorphoses' by the Roman poet Ovid. So, I was very excited to find an artefact in Poole Museum that relates to it. To create the artworks, I enlarged text from the tale of Silenus, Bacchus and Midas, produced silkscreens and then used these to build dense compositions on paper. Each layer of text was then gilded with imitation gold leaf. The result was the Midas range of artworks."

Alchemy, comprising over 20 artworks, is on display at Poole Museum from 1 February to 19 April 2020. The partner museums involved in the project are Wiltshire Museum, The Salisbury Museum and Dorset County Museum. Further details are available at www.poolemuseum.org.uk.

### Poole Museum awarded National Lottery support to transform its public spaces and displays

BCP Council is pleased to announce that it has been awarded initial support from The National Lottery Heritage Fund for the Poole Museum project, "Our Museum: Rediscovering Poole's Maritime Heritage".

Thanks to money raised by National Lottery players, The National Lottery Heritage Fund has awarded initial support and development funding of £325,300. This will enable the museum to develop the project plans in more detail and apply for a full grant of £2.4 million in Spring/Summer 2021.

The £3.3 million project aims to create an inspiring cultural attraction for Poole, featuring cuttingedge digital interpretations and new public facilities which will transform the visitor experience. The National Lottery grant will enable conservation of an internationally important historic building, the display of Poole Museum's unique collection of four ancient vessels, and the creation of stunning new spaces for local people and visitors to enjoy.

The Museum will work with the community and the region's universities to create the new spaces, which include a maritime gallery to share Poole's remarkable maritime heritage. Stories of boatbuilding, fishing and merchant trades from local people will enrich the museum's collections for future generations. The project will provide exciting new opportunities for learning and hands-on interaction.

Poole Museum's audiences have doubled since its last redevelopment in 2007 and have outgrown the existing spaces and facilities. This project will enable the Museum to meet growing demand and build on our success in a sustainable way. The National Lottery grant will also enable us to restore and reveal the magnificent Poole Wool Hall, one of the most important medieval port buildings in Europe.

Poole Museum Foundation will be raising match funding for the project.

### Meet PMF Trustee and guest cruise director Peter Burt:

Peter has spent a lifetime boating and sailing, from the early age of three years old. He has been involved in archaeological explorations in Poole Harbour since the early 80's, but had a deep interest long before then.

He was a Poole Harbour Commissioner for 12 years, from 1988 to 2010, as well as a Flag Officer at the Royal Motor Yacht Club and Commodore from 1995-97, running the Club.

Peter has been the owner and operator of a small boatyard in West Quay Road since 1970. Between the years of 1962 to 2001 he was in the marine trade working on the waterfront and thus came to know the Harbour and its people quite well.

In 1996 Peter created and chaired Poole Harbour Watch, (a neighbourhood watch afloat) with the help of local policeman and the Chief Constable of Dorset, which is still running today with the aim of keeping Poole Harbour crime free.
