



The first "Masonic Book" printed in America was Benjamin Franklin's reprint of Anderson's Constitutions in 1734.

Only 17 copies were printed, and it's said to be the rarest masonic book ever.






The bible used for George Washington's inauguration was borrowed from St John's Lodge No O1.

The bible is still in possession of the Lodge to this day and can be seen in the Lodge museum.
