Relics and the Sacramentality of the Catholic Faith

I ended last week's reflection with the statement that everything is sacred. When God said, "Let there be light!" everything came into being and God said it was good, very good. God didn't make anything that is not good or not sacred. It's with this thought that we are invited to navigate in this world. All is sacred, all is gift.

Human beings are especially sacred because we are made in the image of God and that is manifested in the fact that humans have an immortal soul. Aguinas establishes, "three levels to soul activity." Those three levels of soul activity are vegetative powers, sense powers and intellectual powers, each corresponding with the distinctiveness of the soul based on its ability. Plants have vegetative powers; animals have sense powers; humans have all three. We share with God the Good, the Beautiful and the True. We have the freedom to choose to be more fully whom we are meant to be, which is Godlike, or we can choose to refuse. This sets humans apart from all other beings. Being in the image of God, the human individual possesses the dignity of a person, who is not just something, but someone. He is capable of selfknowledge, of self-possession and of freely giving himself and entering into communion with other persons. Plants are not like that; animals do not have these capabilities. They do not know about tomorrow. They do not make art.

And relics? What's this got to do with relics?

Well, this sense of the importance of the body and soul, the sacredness of the human person, the body as a temple of the Holy Spirit and the sacramental worldview of our faith lead us to honor our dead in a way that non-Catholics do not.

Catholics revere the saints, and we reserve a special place in our hearts for the bodies of the saints. It goes back to the Exodus when Moses carried the bones of Joseph out of Egypt 400 years after he died. It goes back to 2 Kings 13:21 "And as a man was being buried, lo, a marauding band was seen and the man was cast into the grave of Eli'sha; and as soon as the man touched the bones of Eli'sha, he revived, and stood on his feet."

In the early persecutions of the Church, Mass was often offered, hidden in the catacombs with the altar being the tomb of a martyr. That tradition has carried on through time so that every main altar in a church was consecrated and relics of saints, especially martyrs, have been secured somewhere in the altar. This is why the priest kisses the altar at the beginning and the end of the Mass. (Unfortunately, so far, I have not been able to establish whose relics are under our altar. I'm told, probably some Canadian martyrs.)

Although at first glance, the idea of keeping and revering relics may seem like a macabre practice, it is, in reality, a way of acknowledging and honoring the unity of body and soul.



Pro-abortion claim: :Abortion is medically necessary in some cases to save the mother's life Pro-life response: Abortion is never medically neces

Pro-Life response: Abortion is never medically necessary, even in cases where there is danger to the mother's life by continuing with the pregnancy. In the situation of a pregnant mother who has a serious medical condition, such as, for example, heart disease, life-threatening diabetes, or cancer, there are always two patients in need of healthcare: the mother and her preborn baby. If care for the mother requires that pregnancy end before the baby's natural birthdate, a preterm delivery, for example, by Caesarean section, can be performed on the mother with the goal of saving and preserving the baby's life. Over one thousand doctors have signed the Dublin Declaration on Maternal Healthcare stating that "As experienced practitioners and researchers in obstetrics and gynaecology, we affirm that direct abortion-the purposeful destruction of the unborn child-is not medically necessary to save the life of a woman." They add: "We confirm that the prohibition of abortion does not affect, in anyway, the availability of optimal care to pregnant women." Thus, in cases where the pregnant mother's life is truly in jeopardy, her pregnancy must come to an end, not by abortion, but by the baby's early birth.




