Stewardship Reflection - The Ascension of the Lord What It Is

I was listening to a talk by Bishop Robert Barron the other day about 'quiddity' or the 'is-ness' of a thing. Quiddity means the inherent essence or nature of something or someone: what it is. It is very helpful to understand this idea.

The gist of what Bishop Barron was saying is that a thing is what it is and is nothing else, even as it develops and changes. We think of a river that becomes a mighty river from a tiny source, joined by many tributaries, adding to its volume, growing as it exists in space and time until it reaches the ocean. Think of the source of the mighty Fraser River, from a little spring on the Alberta/BC border and runs 1,370 kilometers to the Georgia Straight. The source and the mouth look completely different but it's the same river; it has only become more fully itself.

Living things change to remain the same, and to become better at what they are. They continue to develop the essence of what they are to become more fully their self. When a living thing dies, it means it has stopped changing. It becomes something else. It is no longer itself. A dead tree in the forest becomes food for the soil and the insects. It is no longer a tree.

Living things are marked by change and development.

"To live is to change. To be perfect is to change often."

(St. John Henry Cardinal Neuman)

Two very important points I draw from this are: One, when we speak of human life, this idea helps us to understand that the human created person at conception, is the same person who changes and develops throughout their

lives to become more fully who they are, even if they live to be 150 years old. When we die, our body and soul separate and the body becomes a corpse. It is dead. The soul lives forever and will be reunited with our glorified body at the end of time.

The second point: ideas also develop in order to remain themselves. As this concerns the Word of God being passed on through time and space, theologian after theologian, century after century, it requires an Advocate who will guide us, the Church, into all truth. The Word of God remains what it is and our understanding of it develops over time. Jesus tells us the Holy Spirit will teach us everything as we grow deeper into the Paschal Mystery.

As I mentioned, I was listening to Bishop Barron - that's where I got these ideas; he got them from Jesus, Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, St. John Henry Cardinal Neuman, St. Thomas Aquinas and many others. This is to his point that the idea develops over time, through space and a myriad of thinkers and believers to become better at being more authentically itself, like a river, like a tree, like a human. And now, Dear Reader,



you have this idea. How will you develop it? What will you do with it? Will you explore it, share it and use it to enlighten others and help bring them to Jesus Christ? I pray you do. It is, after all, what it is.
