Stewardship Reflection - Sixth Sunday of Easter

The Vine

"I am the vine, you are the branches."

It's possible, even likely, that Jesus said these words as he travelled with his Apostles down to the Kidron Valley toward the Garden of Gethsemane. He might have looked back at the city of Jerusalem and seen the towering "great east facade of the temple, its four-story solid gold cluster of grapes and the gold-plated spires glistening in the white light of the Nisan moon."[1] The Nisan moon is the full moon in the month of the Passover and if you could imagine seeing that massive white marble structure with its huge gold ornamentation, standing out over the temple wall, you could understand that Jesus, catching a glimpse of the golden grapevine with its clusters of grapes decorating the temple facade, might have thought of the analogy of the vine and the branches.

It's a thought. But wherever Jesus got his inspiration, this analogy is a winner. It is such a perfect analogy for teaching the concept of our total dependency on him for our lives. We cannot live apart from him. It's really so simple. "He is the power and energy source in which we live." (Bishop Robert Barron)

On Wednesday morning this week, the same morning that I proclaimed this very gospel, I went out onto the front porch of the rectory for that early morning fresh air, and I saw a branch

that had broken off the vine growing along the side of the house. It was a young branch but it was withered and dying, if not dead. I picked it up and as I held it in my hands, I couldn't help but think, this is what Jesus is talking about. This branch has zero chance of living unless it is grafted back onto the vine. I didn't have a fire to throw it into, so I tossed it onto the lawn, where now it's probably been mulched into the soil.

That's how it is. We need to draw our spiritual nourishment from the Lord. He is the source of supernatural life in us. We are attached to him, and we receive our life from him. He holds us in being and if we go away from him, if we don't keep his word, we drift off into the world and we die, spiritually. This is reality: that we are body and soul, flesh and spirit. We live in this world, but we are not OF this world. The Lord is our salvation who gives us his peace. He does not give as the world gives, he tells us. No, what Jesus gives is true and sure and honest and forever.

Our job is to open the channels of communication with him through prayer and the sacraments to more easily allow his grace to flow into us, to nurture us like sap from the vine.




