The Paradox of Christianity II

In last week's reflection, I brought the falsely accused, tortured, put on a idea forward that the difficulty and the simplicity of Christianity present us with a paradox that requires some out-ofthe-box thinking to begin to appreciate.

Jesus often says things that, from a perspective, might natural seem unnatural. Things like, "You have heard it said that 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' 'But I say to you, love your enemies, and pray for those who persecute you'." (Matthew 5: 43-44)

Before Jesus, hatred of evil persons was assumed to be the correct attitude. You would never pray for your persecutor. It's only natural, right? It's totally unnatural for us to pray for our enemies and to love the person who hurt us. This is the effect of the Fall. It's the effect of original sin that has been carried in humanity throughout time. We have lost the sense of solidarity that we had in the garden, the sense that we are made in the image of God, the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Jesus came to set us straight, to get us to see the reality of existence through him, to get us back to the garden. If we can persevere in listening to his word and studying what he means, we will be able to see reality in a new and different light. The worldly way of thinking will be shattered and exposed for what it is: a dead end, a downward spiral of unhappiness and disappointment.

But I suppose the great paradox of Christianity is the cross. The King of Kings, the Messiah, the one who has come to redeem the world is arrested,

Roman cross and dies an ignominious death in abject humiliation, with nary a friend in sight. It couldn't be worse. But wait! What's this? He rises from the dead on the third day, just as he said? He defeats death? Not just for himself but for you? Yes!

If it's true, then why do not all people get on board with him and live a life of Christian joy? Jesus gives us the answer in his nocturnal (secret) conversation with Nicodemus, the great teacher of Israel, "And this is the verdict, that the light came into the world, but people preferred darkness to light, because their works were evil." (John 3:19)

It's sad to think that we reject the author of life and all he offers us because we prefer the darkness to the light. I'm afraid it's true. It's easier to wallow in the comfort of our error than to try to correct it. It requires diligence and perseverance to continue toward the light. To our eternal detriment, we turn away from what is good for us, to what is ruinous for our souls because we can not believe the truth. G.K. Chesterton wrote,

"... whenever we feel there is something odd in Christian theology, we shall generally find that there is something odd about the truth."

That's because the truth is most often surprising. And that is a paradox.




