Stewardship Reflection

Second Sunday of Lent

Love and Death: Inseparable

All love that does not take its origin from the Savior's passion is foolish and perilous. Unhappy is death without the Savior's love; unhappy is love without the Savior's death. Love and death are so mingled in the Savior's passion that we cannot have one in our hearts without the other. Upon Calvary we cannot have life without love or love without the Redeemer's death... there is (only) eternal death or eternal love. All Christian wisdom consists in choosing rightly.

Treatise on the Love of God, St. Francis de Sales (Book XII, Chapter 13).

Christians are often accused of placing too much emphasis on suffering and death, especially Catholics who insist on displaying a corpus, a body on the cross. Why can't we just use a plain cross as a symbol of what happened? Because we want to have his love ever in front of us. As St. Francis de Sales tells us, Christ's love and his death are inseparable.

Body and Soul

"Love and death are so mingled in the Savior's passion that we cannot have one in our hearts without the other."

It is not unlike the fact of our body and soul. We are our body; we are our soul. It's not that I have a body, and my body has a soul. I am body and soul. Body and soul are so mingled that you can't have one without the other. We cannot separate body and soul except by death. When we understand this, we can understand implicitly, that we must never think of others as having less dignity than ourselves. For this reason, we can never cause harm to another person.

The contradiction of the cross

The contradiction of the cross is that Jesus suffered and died in order to rise from the dead and that we will rise with him some day. It's called a sign of contradiction because the way of the world is so different from the ways of God. St. Paul says the cross is

"a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles" (1 Cor 1:23).

The teachings of Jesus are full of notions that seem contradictory to the natural human way of thinking: Love your enemies. The greatest will be the servant of all. The first shall be last.

By incorporating these contradictions into our life, we can use them as a mountain climber seeks a place to put hand or foot, a hold that we can grasp to pull ourselves further up the mountain.

The humility of Christ is a great contradiction. That the king of the universe, the creator of all that is, comes to live his human life in poverty and allows himself to be tortured and killed by crucifixion, displays the greatest act of humility of all time.

Humility forms the foundation of love. Was there ever a more humble act than Jesus' Passion?

So, the death of Jesus is inseparable from his love. We cannot love without bringing Christ into the equation. And one day, we will die. That will be a good thing because we are united in love with Jesus.
















Stations of the Cross

The Stations of the Cross are a prayerful, powerful way to focus on Jesus' Passion. There are short prayers at each of the 14 Stations, allowing us to pray and meditate on each specific part of Jesus' final journey. All are invited every Friday during Lent at 6 pm, followed by Mass at 7 pm.



What's the deal about 40

Lent is 40 days long, plus Sundays. Why 40? Is the number 40 significant? Noah and his family endured 40 days of rain. Moses was on Mt. Sinai for 40 days before receiving the 10 Commandments. The Israelites wandered in the desert for 40 years before entering the Promised land. Elijah walked for 40 days to Mt. Horeb before anointing the next king and next prophet. Jesus fasted for 40 days before starting his public ministry. Jesus ascended 40 days after his resurrection. In every instance, and there are many more in the Old Testament, God was preparing his people; it was a period of trial or testing. And, in every instance, there was a shift, an important change, with new life coming forth afterward. The 40 days were a time of turning away from their usual ways, of repenting of their hardness of heart, or of engaging more with the Father and deciding to trust him in something new. We are truly blessed during Lent to be called to do the same.



The 40 Days for Life campaign consists of 40 days of prayer, fasting, and a peaceful vigil at 32nd Ave. and Willow. Why participate? Because prayer works. Because lives are saved. Because the need is great. Because all life has dignity.

You can participate in many ways, including: Join us for one hour of prayer in front of the St. Joseph's Residence for Retired Priests (32nd Ave. and Willow in Vancouver) on March 26 and April 5; Attend Eucharistic Adoration for 40 Days for Life every Wednesday 9 am to 9 pm; Daily prayers of Reverence for Life; Nightly Rosary via Zoom on Behold Vancouver.




