

"The End Is Everywhere in the Story" Aristotle

This week, at our Clergy Study Week, I was given the opportunity to present a film to my brother priests. I chose a French film by Robert Bresson, made in 1950, called *"Diary of a Country Priest"*.

It is the story of a young priest in a village in France who arrives at his first parish and realizes he is facing an uncaring, indifferent congregation who don't want him around. It is a rather bleak situation and a bleak film. On top of everything else, the priest is very sick. The only food his stomach will tolerate is red wine mixed with hard bread. Perhaps you can see where this is going: yes, he is very much a Christ figure.... He suffers, he is mistreated and misunderstood, he directly saves at least one soul because of his holiness and his faith and understanding of God. In the end, he dies, and his last words are, "All is grace."

I tell you this because it fits into a theme that I was able to discern through the talks that were given at the Study Week. The idea that "...the end is found everywhere in the story", an idea that may be understood at several layers of meaning. In the case of our young country priest, his death was inevitable and yet he was not aware that that he was dying. All through the film, he was dying.

But the film and the novel from which it was taken would not be authentic

if he suddenly got well at the end and lived happily ever after with his parishioners. That would have been a cheap trick, a falsity, a lie. But it is a work of art, and he finds his true happiness and redemption in Christ. It is a moving and sad ending and yet so gratifying because he did find his happiness in his true end – in Jesus Christ, of course.

In the Old Testament, you will find Christ, in some way, in every book of the Bible. The entire salvation story is pointing to the END – to Jesus Christ. Jesus tells us he is the Alpha and the Omega: the beginning and the end and that he is with us always until the end of time.

God is our true end, the end being the purpose for which we were made. In Psalm 139, The psalmist makes us keenly aware of God's all-knowing gaze:

Where can I hide from your spirit? From your presence, where can I flee? If I ascend to the heavens, you are there; If I lie down in Shoel, you are there too.

...Your eyes foresaw my actions; In your book, all are written down; My days were shaped before one came to be.

God is there in our story, in everyone's story. And God is revealed in the Gospels. "No one has ever seen God. The only Son, God, who is at the Father's side, has revealed him." John 1: 18

This means that God is telling his story through my life, through your life. Christ is everywhere in your story because Christ is the end of your story. When you know that, you can think of yourself as a walking bible because you are carrying God and his Word with you. You may be the only bible that someone will have read. Give thanks and praise for that.

Pray for Holy Souls This November






