Stewardship Reflection Last Day of Christmas Baptism of the Lord What Is Baptism?

What do you say to a child who has no reference to Jesus Christ or to Christianity when they ask, "What is baptism?" That happened to me, and I must say, I was kind of stuck for an answer because all reference points that came to mind would not have been meaningful to the child. As I struggled, the child's mother (a non-practicing Catholic) said, "It's like an initiation into a group." Okay, that's something that the child could understand and it's true. Baptism is, in fact, the first of the sacraments of initiation into the church. And it is, according to the Catechism of the Catholic Church,

"...the basis of the whole of Christian life, the gateway to the life in the spirit, and the door which gives access to the other sacraments."

As many of you may know, I had the honor and the privilege of baptizing my granddaughter, Nora Lynn Beauchamp, in Montreal on January 4. I was thrilled when my daughter asked me to baptize Nora and told me she had gone to her parish priest and arranged everything with him. I believe she is sincere in wanting to raise Nora in the Catholic faith because she wants Nora to live a Catholic life.

I am constantly surprised about how some Catholics think of baptism, though. Especially in our day and age when so many of our children have opted to not participate in the faith; their lives seem to go along just fine without God or the Church in their lives. But they want baptism for their child because they like the tradition, like an early rite of passage. Or maybe it will please the grandparents, or it is something we do as a cultural event and a big celebration follows. And then the baptism is in the

But that is a poor view of the sacrament. Baptism, as I explained to Marie-Claire and the family, is our birth as Christians, our incorporation into the Mystical Body of Christ. The sacraments are where divinity and humanity meet, where God literally reaches out and touches us and fills us with that necessary and oh so nourishing thing called grace.

Spiritually, we die without grace. It is to our soul what water is for our body. And a beautiful thing about baptism is it requires water for this portal to open, this portal through which God reaches through and touches us with his life-giving grace. All the sacraments require some material thing interacting with spirit (or form) as one of the elements of the sacrament: whether it be water, wine, oil or unleavened bread. And that is because we are Body and Soul. We are Matter and Spirit. We don't exist one without the other. God who is pure spirit took on human flesh so that he could meet us where we are and he continues to touch us and teach us through his Word, his Body, his Blood, his Soul and his Divinity.




That's what happened to my little Nora last week. God touched her and she became part of him. That's what baptism is. And that's why I am so grateful and blessed to have been given the privilege to baptize my granddaughter and bring her into the Catholic Church.






