Stewardship Reflection - Fifth Sunday of Easter

Prayer

"Pray, hope, and don't worry!" Padre Pio

"How's your prayer life?" That's a good question to ask yourself if you want to assess where you are on your journey to God. Think about it a minute. How often do you stop and have an encounter with God during the day? A dialogue, perhaps? Usually, it's a monologue. Oh Lord help through my exams, get this report finished on time, I'm in a pickle Lord, get me out of trouble, please cure my cancer, help my brothers and sisters. Do something, Lord!

True story. There was a girl in grade 7 who just moved into a new Catholic school. Her teacher was a priest, and the kids were scheduled for an exam on this particular day. One of the other students raised his hand and said, "Father, before the exam, can we pray the prayer?" The new girl was curious and didn't understand what they were talking about. The priest said, "Okay," and with all the children together continued, "In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, Amen." All the students then raised their eyes to heaven and in unison shouted, And then together, "HELP!" thev concluded, "In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, Amen."

Of course, there are many ways to pray and many things and issues we can bring before the Lord, but the fact is that all humans are ordered toward God and have an innate need to communicate with him. It is part of our nature to want to pray, even if we are not believers. We know instinctively we are at the mercy of something, someone far more powerful than us. Pope Benedict put it like this: "In prayer, man considers himself and his situation before God...and experiences being a

creature in need of help..." We can never be fulfilled on our own. We are creatures in need of help and hope.

relationship with God must Our necessarily exist through some kind of prayer life, some kind of conscious activity in which we engage our Creator. Imagine that whatever that activity is and the more of it there is, then the more we are talking with God and taking part in his life. That's what we need most, to be with him, to spend time with him, to hear his word, to accept his healing, his love and his mercy, to know his justice.

And there are as many ways of approaching prayer as there are people.

Flannery O'Connor, the great twentieth century Catholic American writer started a prayer journal while she was at university as a young woman. Like many young, devout Catholics in that period of their lives, she was confronted with many new anti-religious ideas, some of them provoking doubts of her own faith. But she knew where to bring her suffering and her doubts. She did not abandon the faith. Nor did she abandon her reason. She writes to God, "Dear God, I don't want to have invented my faith to satisfy my weakness. I don't want to have created God in my own image, as they are so fond of saying." She brought her vulnerability and her honest, inquiring heart to God.

However we pray, we must always take the stance of walking humbly before our God. Prayer is a grace. Pray!



All couples planning to be married in this Parish should contact the pastor at least 6 months in advance. Nonparishioners must obtain written permission from your parish.




