Stewardship Reflection -

Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ Corpus Christi

His Body and Blood, Our Daily Bread

On Tuesday evening we finished a fourpart video series on the Eucharist called Presence: The Mystery of the Eucharist. It was well attended, fifty to sixty parishioners faithfully came, watched, listened, and discussed over four weeks, what we know as the "source and the **summit"** of our Catholic Faith, the Holy Eucharist.

During the final episode, the presenter, Dr. Tim Gray of the Augustine Institute, speaks of the objections that various groups have had against the notion of the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Starting with the Jewish authorities, through the Romans, the pagans, the protestants and the modern secular world, Dr. Tim Gray raises their objections and speaks to them. One of the objections that our separated brethren have is that Jesus was speaking metaphorically when he said, "I am the bread of life which has come down from heaven. Anyone who eats my bread will live forever, and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." (John 6: 51)

This means to them that the Eucharist is only a symbol of Christ, a memorial of the Last Supper. Their reasoning is that Jesus also said, "I am the vine." "I am the door." "I am the light of the world." "I am the Good Shepherd." In fact, there are seven "I am" statements by Jesus. Jesus is obviously not a physical door, nor a vine.

The difference is that these other statements were said only once and were clearly designed to draw an analogy, a metaphor, an image, that would help describe the point he was trying to make.

But this statement, "I am the bread if life...", he treats far differently. He speaks of it several times and at great length throughout the Gospel of John.

There are over seventy verses in the Gospel of John to clarify what he means by "I am the bread of life" and only one line for each of the other "I am" statements. He even loses a multitude of disciples over it because "This teaching is too difficult, who can accept it?" (John 6: 60)

When they walk away, Jesus doesn't try to clarify his speech as metaphor. No. He allows his disciples to walk away because he knows his teaching is difficult. Yet, the twelve Apostles stay, and Peter declares that, of course, we don't understand either, and it is difficult for us, but "...we know that you are the Holy One of God." (John 6:69) That's the difference, "We know you are the Holy One of God."

That is what Catholics believe: that the Eucharist really and truly is the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of our Lord. The Eucharist is the mechanism by which Jesus Christ remains with us physically on earth until the end of time. This is why the priesthood and the magisterial structure of the Church were instituted by Jesus: so that we may receive him in Eucharistic communion with himself and with our fellow believers. The Eucharist is mystical, spiritual and physical. The bread and the wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus, and we physically ingest him so that we become part of him, physically and spiritually, and he becomes part of us, spiritually and physically. This is what we pray for in the Lord's Prayer: "Give us this day our daily bread."
