

"You have come to Mount Zion and to the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to innumerable angels in festal gathering, and to the assembly of the first born who are enrolled in heaven, and to God, the judge of all, and to the spirits of the righteous made perfect, and to Jesus, the mediator of the new covenant, and to the sprinkled blood that speaks a better word than the blood of Abel." (Hebrews 12: 22-24)

That's what we will find when we go up to the heavenly Jerusalem.

Since Ash Wednesday, we've been walking with Jesus on his journey up to Jerusalem. It's always UP to Jerusalem. There are two reasons why going to Jerusalem is always referred to as going "up".

First, Jerusalem is located literally "up," in a mountain range and we must literally climb, for that's where the Temple was. So whether you were coming from the north or the south, you were going up to the place where God dwells.

But Jerusalem was also theologically up, up to the holy city, to the new Jerusalem, the earthly location where all true believers will spend eternity with God. Up to Jerusalem, we shall also go!

And here we are at the end of Lent, entering Holy week accompanying Jesus as he goes up to Jerusalem on

Going Up to Jerusalem

Palm Sunday, riding on a colt that had never been ridden, like the conquering Prince of Peace he is.

As we have been reading throughout Lent, Jesus has been going up to Jerusalem and every step of the way, it seems, he's been tangling with the They Jewish authorities. did understand him because they hardened their hearts against him.

At the heart of the struggle between Jesus and the Jewish authorities is that they considered God Majestic and remote. They could take comfort in that idea because if God is remote, we can justify ourselves for not doing God's will. It's kind of like when the boss is away, sometimes the employees will slack off.

But Jesus declares that God is Majestic but NOT remote. God is with us. The Word became flesh and dwelt among us. The Jewish authorities could not bear the idea that God is here, that he lives in us, that we are sacred beings fully connected to God in intimate ways. We must understand that everything we do - secular or sacred - has spiritual consequences. The Catholic Church has a sacramental worldview which means that everything and everyone is sacred. The sacraments are the reality through which God comes into us and spiritually nourishes us with sanctifying grace.


Pro-abortion claim: Women don't regret abortion

Pro-Life response: Numerous post-abortive women make clear the devastation that abortion causes to them, harming them on many levels, including physically, emotionally, psychologically, and spiritually. On a very deep level, they mourn the lost relationship with their child. Medical research organizations, such as the deVeber Institute, collect and publish information on the negative impact abortion has on women. There are many ministries that seek to bring healing to post-abortive women who regret what they've done to their preborn child and who want help, such as Rachel's Vineyard and Silent No More Awareness. 



Holy Week Schedule

Holy Thursday

March 28, 2024

- There is no Morning Mass
- Thursday of The Lord's Supper Mass at 7:00 pm followed by:
- Procession and Eucharistic Adoration until 11:30pm

The early Christian church introduced the custom to imitate the humility and selfless love of Jesus, who washed the feet of the Twelve Apostles at the Last Supper (John 13:1–15), the night before his Crucifixion



Good Friday

March 29, 2024

- There is no Mass on Good Friday
- Stations of the Cross around Laval Square (weather permitting) at 10:00 am (in case of rain, the stations will take place in the church.)
- Friday of the Passion of the Lord at 3:00 pm

Good Friday is a day of fasting requiring Catholics to refrain from eating meat. Traditionally, there is no Mass and no celebration of the Eucharist on Good Friday. A liturgy may still be performed and communion, if taken, comes from hosts consecrated on Holy Thursday. Church bells are silent



Holy Saturday

March 30, 2024

- There will be no Mass until the Vigil Mass at 9:00 pm
- The Resurrection of the Lord At the Easter Vigil in the Holy Night

Mass begins in front of the church at 9:00 pm

- 1 Baptism
- 1 Welcoming into the Church
- 2 Confirmations

Holy Saturday, Christian religious observance that ends the Lenten season, falling on the day before Easter Sunday. The observance commemorates the final day of Christ's death, which many Christians traditionally associate with his triumphant descent into hell or "to the dead" (see also Apostles' Creed).

March 31, 2024

The Resurrection of the Lord - Easter Sunday - The Mass of Easter Day

- 9:00 am Mass
- 11:00 am Mass

Easter is the day Jesus rose from the dead after being crucified. The empty tomb means that Jesus's words rang true. He fulfilled the promises of Scripture and conquered sin and death.




