Stewardship Reflection Third Sunday of Lent

Contrition, Confession, Penance, Forgiveness = Liberation

My sacrifice, O Lord, a contrite spirit. A humbled, contrite heart you will not spurn

Psalm 51: 19

The Sacrament of Penance, also known as the Sacrament of Reconciliation, or simply, Confession, is the sacrament instituted by Christ out of sheer mercy for us fallen human beings. We, who have lost grace, who have turned from God, sometimes gravely and sometimes only through our inability to live saintly lives, where and how do we recover grace and rise anew to the life brought to us by Christ in our baptism?

It happens in the confessional, in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

In God's wisdom, knowing that we don't always get it right, that we in fact, slip away from our path to glory, he pardons us, he has pity on us, and he is all merciful to us. **Pardon** presupposes debts to be forgiven; **pity and mercy** can only exist where there is **misery**. And what is **mercy**? St. Thomas allows that "it is the taking of another's misery into one's own heart." That's what God does with our misery and our sin; in his mercy, he takes it to himself.

We are all sinners, some more than others, it's only a question of degree. St. John tells us,

"If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us." (1John 4: 8)

The sacrament of Penance was instituted by Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, so that we can, in our feeble humanity, always return to his Divine love and that our souls may be again filled with his grace as our sins are wiped away, **absolved**.

But what is necessary on our part? What obligations do we need to meet to accept such an immense and life-

saving gift? In order that this unlimited grace of forgiveness may act in our soul, all obstacles opposed to this action must be removed. And what are the obstacles? Sin and the attachment to sin.

To disavowal ourselves of sin and our attachment to it, the first thing we need is **a contrite heart**. Contrition is the sense of sorrow that enlightens the soul to its unhappy state and its offence against God. With it comes a resolve not to commit the sin again. It is the most important element that we bring to the sacrament. Before confession, we need to ask the Lord for the sentiment of repentance and humility which will lead us to contrition.

And contrition leads us to the confessional where we declare our sins out loud to God through the instrument of another human being, a priest. It is there that we accuse ourselves of just how we have offended our Lord. That is the confession, another most critical element to the sacrament. It must be made from the heart.

After that comes the penance. All forgiveness is granted us in virtue of the penance.

Forgiveness comes from God through the priest who represents him. The priest is *in persona Christie* when he says the words of absolution, "I absolve you from your sins in the name of..." It is at this point that pardon is bestowed on us and Divine life is restored to us. It is here that we find liberation from the effects of sin in our lives.






