#### **Stewardship Reflection** Palm Sunday The Passion of the Lord

#### Hosanna in the Highest

The Lenten Season is coming to a close as Jesus marches up to Jerusalem. Do you know that there were about 80,000 people living in Jerusalem at the time of Jesus? Maybe more. As many as 500,000 people, Jews from the diaspora around the known world and, of course, from all over Palestine went "up to Jerusalem" for the Passover the year that Christ died.

Jerusalem is described in Psalm 122, "Jerusalem is built as a city, strongly compact. It is there that the tribes go up, the tribes of the Lord." Compact indeed and can you imagine 500,000 pilgrims making their way there every Passover? Where would they all stay? Well, the whole area around the walled city was dotted with tents pitched by the pilgrims. And they all brought their lambs or goats for the sacrifice and the Passover meal. The lambs were all slaughtered on Thursday afternoon in time for the meal that evening. The blood flowed down the mountainside. It must have been a spectacular sight as day turned into night, smoke filling the air with thousands of cooking fires and lanterns as far as the eye could see.

Can you imagine the chaos in Jerusalem and its immediate surroundings the day Jesus triumphantly entered Jerusalem on a donkey, a sign of a king who is coming in peace, if there ever was one? Many pilgrims knew who Jesus was or at least had heard of him. Many had seen him speaking as he travelled throughout Israel. He was the most well known person among the Jews. He was like a rock star. And many of these folks were believers. These were the ones singing "Hosanna in the Highest, blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord."

The people who were shouting, "Crucify him, crucify him" four days later were the ones who did not know him, and they were mostly residents of Jerusalem.

I hope you have had the kind of Lent that will allow you to absorb the pain of Good Friday and properly grieve and mourn over the injustice that was committed against the Prince of Peace; so that by the time of his Resurrection you will truly erupt with the joy of knowing that your salvation is possible because of this astounding event.



#### **Stations of the Cross**

The Stations of the Cross are a prayerful, powerful way to focus on Jesus' Passion. There are short prayers at each of the 14 Stations, allowing us to pray and meditate on each specific part of Jesus' final journey. All are invited every Friday during Lent at 6 pm, followed by Mass at 7 pm.

#### At the Foot of the Cross

At the foot of the cross, surrounding the cross, and nearby, there were many people. Most were there to watch the spectacle of the crucifixion. The soldiers were there to keep order. Mary, the women, and John were there out of love for Jesus. Jesus, of course, is there out of love for us.

The cross is where heaven touches earth; it is the antidote for everything. It is the intersection of humanity and divinity. It is the place where Christ won victory over all our human weaknesses and sins. No matter what is going on in our lives or how we feel we can come to Christ crucified for help.

Our sins meet his forgiveness
Our failures meet his mercy
Our weaknesses meet his strength
Our fear meets his love
Our loneliness meets his Presence
Our doubts meet his assurance
Our wounds meet his healing
Our anxiety meets his peace
By being at the foot of the cross,
contemplating His love for us and laying
our worries, burdens and fears there, we
exchange our frailties for his gifts.


