About Us

The Greenville County Behavioral Health Coalition was officially convened by United Way of Greenville County in the summer of 2018. In 2021, the Greenville County Behavioral Health Coalition re-launched as the **Well Being Partnership of Greenville (WBP)**. This work was initiated in part by generous support from the Graham Foundation and the Jolley Foundation.

The coalition currently includes over 50 partners representing health systems, the mental health organizations, public and private treatment providers, nonprofits, and faith-based services. These member organizations have come together to address barriers affecting access to behavioral health services. The current host organization and fiscal agent of the WBP is the Phoenix Center.

WBP Mission

To advance cultural, community, and clinical change to improve mental, emotional and physical well-being. -- Our goal in this collaboration is to be a resource and to have as many voices as possible represented in the conversation as we move forward in serving our community.

WBP Vision

Optimal mental health and well-being for all Greenville County residents.

- DATA:** To be intentional in our efforts, define a baseline on meaningful metrics, and to be able to measure positive changes in the community effectively.
- SOLUTIONS:** To seek out innovative ways to improve access to and increase capacity of services as well as to develop appropriate services where gaps in care exist.
- ADVOCACY:** To focus on reducing stigma towards people who may have behavioral health diagnoses and to be proactive in meeting the needs in our community.
