Results-Based Accountability TM Training Overview

Results-Based Accountability<sup>™</sup> (RBA) is a disciplined way of thinking and acting to improve entrenched and complex social problems. It is a data-driven decision-making process to help communities and organizations get beyond talking about problems to solving them.

#### The blended training has two parts:



1. Online module focused on foundational principles.



2. Live session that covers application & implementation. Participants will complete an example turn the curve activity throughout the session.

## PROGRAM OBJECTIVES FOR THE ONLINE MODULE

#### At the completion of this activity, participants will be able to:

- Define the three (3) main guiding principles of the Results-Based Accountability<sup>TM</sup> (RBA) framework.
- Explain the value of common language, a guiding principle of the RBA framework.
- Discuss how population accountability applies to whole populations (communities, cities, counties, states, & nations).
- Describe how performance accountability applies to client populations (programs, organizations, agencies, & service systems).
- Identify the purpose of the five core questions of Turn the Curve Thinking that moves from talk to action.
- Recognize what it looks like when a community is applying the RBA method.



## PROGRAM OBJECTIVES FOR EACH LIVE SESSION

#### At the completion of this activity, participants will be able to:

- State the three guiding principles of the Results-Based Accountability<sup>™</sup> framework.
- Explain the Collective Impact model and make the connection of how it supports the RBA methodology.
- Demonstrate use of the RBA framework by outlining how their organizations, along with partner organizations, can enhance alignment.
- Discuss the value of producing a common language, a vital component of the RBA framework.
- Appraise results and indicators with a diverse group of partners.
- Develop performance measures for programs that answer the questions: How much did we do? How well did we do it? Is anyone better off?
- Demonstrate Turn the Curve Thinking using the five core questions.
