A Note from FAS President, Dr. John Daly

Summer has passed, and the holiday season is at our doorstep. A lot has happened at the Fallbrook Animal Sanctuary this year. In January we opened our Whiskers and Tails retail shop and due to the dedication and hard work of our volunteers it has had a successful year. Whiskers and Tails is an expansion of the Christmas Store that FAS had operated during the holiday season for the past several years, and 100% of the profit from the store goes to the animal sanctuary. Come visit us and look around, there are many wonderful treasures to be found.

There has been a lot going on at the sanctuary this year as well. A new dog exercise area has been added and construction has been completed on a new cat housing area. These projects were funded by contributions from donors specifically designated for infrastructure improvements and will help improve the health and wellbeing of the cats and dogs that come under our care for many years in the future. We are very thankful for the kindness and generosity of our donors, and the cats and dogs approve of the improvements.

The sanctuary still has many challenges we must face in the coming months and years. Our operational expenses are increasing, most importantly the cost of veterinary care has increased substantially in recent years and is a major portion of our operational budget. Many of the animals that come into the sanctuary have medical problems or injuries that require veterinary care. FAS has two programs to raise funds to meet these expenses. One is the Winslow Warriors fund which raises money for emergency veterinary care and surgeries. The other is our Giving Tuesday appeal to raise funds for spay and neuter clinics. This year we brought in about 400 cats and over 50 dogs and there is no sign of a decrease in the numbers needing care and placement in the future. If you want to help, please consider donating to one of these funds or making a donation to our general fund for operational expenses. In the coming holiday season, there are many other ways you can help with our mission to rescue, rehabilitate, and rehome homeless dogs and cats. You can return the envelope accompanying this newsletter with a donation, or you could shop at Whiskers and Tails for your holiday needs such as Christmas ornaments and trees, gift items, or other holiday novelties. There is also the option of making a legacy gift from a will, trust, or estate.

In closing I wish to say happy holidays and thank you to all the supporters, donors, volunteers, foster families, and the community of Fallbrook. I am proud to be part of a community that shows so much kindness and generosity. Thank you for all you have done for the thousands of cats, kittens, dogs, and puppies that have found their way to Fallbrook Animal Sanctuary.

Puppies and kittens can be spayed/neutered as young as 8 weeks old. Don't delay.

Advantages

- Spayed females won't experience the physical and behavioral issues associated with going into heat.
- Neutered males are generally better behaved and less likely to roam away from home.
- The risk of certain cancers is lowered and, in some cases, eliminated.
- Over 32,000 kittens can potentially be born from one unspayed female cat and her offspring in seven years. Spaying significantly reduces pet overpopulation.

Giving Tuesday

As the holidays quickly approach us, we are making our list and checking it twice. At the top of our list is free and affordable spay and neuters for all pets. Shelters and rescues are in crisis with an overpopulation of dogs and cats. Whether they are abandoned. relinquished, or stray, we have never seen intake numbers like this before. FAS has rescued over 350 kittens alone this year. That is in addition to the countless dogs, cats, and puppies. The top two reasons we hear are that either the kittens were found or it was an accidental litter. There are no accidental litters. If your pet is not spayed, you can absolutely expect a litter. We may not be able to change the past but we can change the future and that starts with reducing the amount of animals that are entering our shelters everyday. The only way to do that is by spaying and neutering your pets.

In 2023, your generosity raised enough funds to provide 13 FREE spay and neuter clinics with SNAP (Spay Neuter Action Project) this year. That is approximately 400 pets who will not add to the overpopulation of dogs and cats who suffer needlessly in shelters, on the streets, sick and injured, and being euthanized by the thousands daily simply because there is not enough space.

This Giving Tuesday, please help us save thousands of more lives by donating to our Spay and Neuter Campaign. Our goal is to provide 6 FREE clinics in 2025. That represents almost 200 pets receiving the ultimate gift of spay and neuter. Once again

this year, an anonymous donor has graciously offered to match every dollar donated up to \$10,500 to help us meet our goal of \$21,000. By spaying and neutering up to 200 cats and dogs in 2025, we are saving the lives of thousands in the years to come.
