FAS receives no government funds, relying on donations from the public.

A Note from the FAS Board of Directors

As every small business owner or family budget manager knows, bringing in sufficient income to cover expenses is critical to keeping a business open or a family afloat. Unexpected costs can tip the scales unfavorably. No matter how carefully you plan, life happens, and it frequently hands you issues that weren't in the plan.

The Fallbrook Animal Sanctuary is no exception. While some expenses are predictable (rent, insurance, utilities, etc.), many surprises await the FAS budget each month. An influx of tiny kittens that require special supplies for their foster families, or a puppy who arrives at the shelter with catastrophic medical needs, can offset months of fundraising efforts.

As a no-kill shelter, the FAS strives to support every animal who comes into our care until their forever family takes them home. For some, this may only mean a few days of meeting their basic needs. For others, thousands of dollars of veterinary treatment and months of specialized care may be necessary. We will do whatever is needed to keep the dogs and cats at FAS happy and healthy.

Adoption fees may seem expensive to some, but every animal leaves the shelter vaccinated, microchipped, dewormed, and spayed/neutered. The total cost of these procedures is often higher than the fee charged to the adopter. FAS makes a substantial financial investment in every puppy, kitten, dog, and cat. In addition to finding them the perfect family to join, FAS is committed to ensuring that every animal leaves our care fully prepared medically to lead their best life.

From January through June of 2019, FAS spent \$ 74,591.20 for veterinary expenses alone. By comparison, facilities expenditures (rent, utilities,

maintenance, etc.) totaled \$24,661.28 for the same time period. As a non-profit organization receiving no government funding, these expenses can be staggering.

We know that we frequently come to you with our hands out hoping for a donation. Please be aware that the unpaid volunteers who work tirelessly on behalf of the animals would love to spend more time on critter care and less on fundraising. But that balance sheet will still be there. Without your help, the doors could close forever.

Please consider setting up a recurring monthly donation. Even \$5 per month, multiplied by the numerous kind folks who support FAS, can make a substantial impact. You can set this up through PayPal on our web site or call the sanctuary for assistance. Thank you so very much in advance on behalf of the animals in need who call the Fallbrook Animal Sanctuary their home.


