A Note from FAS President, Dr. John Daly

Happy Summer everyone! I want to dedicate my letter this edition to our volunteers. Fallbrook Animal Sanctuary is a volunteer-run facility and would not exist without the hard work and dedication of our volunteers. Animal enclosures must be cleaned, our commercial washing machine runs all day, and all floors must be cleaned and disinfected to decrease the risk of disease. Then there is the feeding! Many of our animals require special diets that need to be closely monitored. Once they have been fed, there are food bowls to be washed and sanitized. Volunteers also monitor the health status of each animal resident at FAS and make sure that any changes are brought to the attention of medical staff. It is also very important that animals are exercised regularly and receive stimulation and socialization. Who does this? You guessed it - volunteers!

Another group of volunteers are our foster families. Many of our animals are cared for in foster homes where they can receive closely supervised care in a home environment. This is especially true for very young kittens, who are frequently malnourished. These kittens require bottle feeding with a special formula every few hours, and our amazing volunteers open their homes and hearts to them. Foster care also provides in-home socialization in preparation for when they are well enough for adoption into a forever home.

There are many administrative duties involved in running a facility like FAS. Supplies need to be ordered, bills need to be paid, and medical care must be coordinated. Adoptions must be arranged. There is no paid administrative staff and all these duties are performed by volunteers.

Whiskers & Tails, our resale shop that generates income for FAS by selling donated quality items, is also staffed by volunteers. Those volunteers collect and sort, price and arrange donations in the store, and manage the store.

One more class of volunteers that is vital to our mission are the generous donors who share their good fortune and wealth in the form of donations to FAS. Without them we could not keep the lights on, pay the food bills and veterinary expenses, or perform any of the services we provide for the animals. FAS has been part of the Fallbrook community for the past 23 years because of the kindness and generosity of our volunteers and donors and we are grateful to you all.

Advantages

- Spayed females won't experience the physical and behavioral issues associated with going into heat.
- Neutered males are generally better behaved and less likely to roam away from home.
- The risk of certain cancers is lowered and, in some cases, eliminated.
- Over 32,000 kittens can potentially be born from one unspayed female cat and her offspring in seven years. Spaying significantly reduces pet overpopulation.


