23 JUNE 2024 - 12TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Mission Statement: The parish of St. Mary Magdalene is a Catholic community of Christian faith with three churches – Saint Paul's in Glenrothes, Saint Mary's in Leslie and the Chapel Royal in Falkland. We are centred on the Word of God and the Eucharist.

This Sunday's first reading is a rare example in the Sunday lectionary of the book of Job. The account of Job's misfortunes is the backdrop for a series of speeches in which the problem of suffering is reviewed. Job's innocent suffering calls into question the belief that the good person is rewarded in this life, and the bad one suffers. Job does not hesitate to accuse God of injustice and bullying, but at the same time he clings to God and is confident of God's unfailing care. Towards the end of the book Job receives an overwhelming experience of the majesty, power and wisdom of God. Human beings are unable to fully understand the ways of God.

The gospel passage is a practical illustration of the infinite power of God being embodied in Jesus, but despite all that has already happened in the course of Jesus' ministry, the disciples in the boat are still trying to work out who exactly Jesus is.

The second reading is a small masterpiece of Christian faith with the succinct statement that "for anyone who is in Christ there is a new creation", the old having passed away. Do we truly believe that we already share in this new creation?

Question of the Week: How do I walk by faith, showing my trust in God and things I cannot see? Can I recall a recent occasion in which I chose to put my trust in God?
