12 JANUARY 2025 - THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD - FEAST

Mission Statement: The parish of St. Mary Magdalene is a Catholic community of Christian faith with three churches – Saint Paul's in Glenrothes, Saint Mary's in Leslie and the Chapel Royal in Falkland. We are centred on the Word of God and the Eucharist.

Our mission is to live the Gospel and share it with those we meet. We are a welcoming and inclusive community of prayerful disciples, using our gifts for the glory of God and in service to one another and our neighbours. We are committed to do this now and in the future through:

This Sunday's feast continues the theme of "epiphany" – the voice from heaven after Jesus' baptism further manifests who Jesus is in relation to God the Father, and through our reception of the sacrament of baptism we share in Jesus' relationship with his Father becoming adopted children of God.

When we were baptized, the Holy Spirit was poured out on us, much as we hear in the second reading. The letter to Titus asserts that with our "bath of rebirth" we "become heirs in hope of eternal life" (Tit 3:5-7). How appropriate as we begin this jubilee year as pilgrims of hope. Our baptism confers upon us a share in the salvation brought by Jesus, who was the first to receive the Holy Spirit in baptism, enabling us to hope for more than this world could ever give: for life eternal with the Lord.

May this hope for our future bring us the comfort that Isaiah promises, the desire "to live temperately, justly, and devoutly" that Paul commends (Tit 2:12), and the reassurance we hear from the Father when Jesus is baptized. We have been baptized in Christ. We are God's beloved children, baptized in the name of the Father, and

of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. In us, God is well pleased. God continues to shower us with grace, as was poured down on us in a special way in baptism, as we live out our baptismal calling. Significantly, before the Father spoke to him at his baptism, Jesus prayed to God, initiating a dialogue with the Father. May we initiate that dialogue as well, again and again, praying that God's grace, poured down on us from the heavens, helps us grow into the beloved sons and daughters God calls us to be.

Question of the Day: How can setting even five or ten minutes aside for prayer each day help me live out my baptismal calling? Can I resolve to do that each day during this jubilee year?
