OUR MISSION

Love Serving Autism provides inclusive therapeutic racquet sports instruction for neurodivergent children and adults to enhance communication, motor coordination, life skills, and behavior on and off the courts. We offer specialized training and education to racquet sports professionals, teachers, certified therapists, and volunteers seeking adaptive certification.

- Training and education to racquet sports professionals
- Certified speech, occupational, physical, and ABA therapists
- Volunteers for an adaptive and inclusive recreational therapeutic specialization


OUR REASON

In 2023, the CDC reported that approximately 1 in 36 children in the U.S. is diagnosed with an Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD), according to 2018 data, with a lack of therapeutic recreational opportunities to serve the population.

HOW FAR WE HAVE COME

PHYSICAL REACH

In 2017, Love Serving Autism started with one location and 20 school students. Now, we can serve an average of 750 youth and adults across 54 locations. In 2024, we are expanding into 7 new schools and racquet sports facilities.

WHERE WE STARTED

OUR LSA FOUNDER

Reflecting on our humble beginnings stirs a deep sense of gratitude and pride.

LSA was initiated and led by the unyielding commitment of our founder, Lisa Pugliese-LaCroix, who is deeply devoted to uplifting and empowering neurodivergent youth and adults through the avenue of racquet sports.



As a speech therapist specializing in autism for 20 years, the children and adults I've met have given me a new perspective on life. These magnificent individuals continue to teach me patience, humility, kindness, and perseverance. Connecting my professional tennis and speech therapy careers to serve the special needs community is a dream come true and fuels my daily life purpose.

- January 2017: Lisa was inspired to develop a non-profit, Love Serving Autism, a 501(c)(3) organization.
- 2018: LSA establishes a partnership with the USTA FL Section as an adaptive tennis partner.
- **2021:** Lisa was elected by USTA National to Chair the Adaptive Training and Education committee to develop its first adaptive tennis curriculum.
- 2022: Lisa is the recipient of USTA National's Eve Kraft Award for community service.
- 2023: Lisa was re-elected as the USPTA National Adaptive Task Force Chair and the USTA National Training & Education Committee Chair.
- 2024: Lisa received the Professional Tennis Registry's Humanitarian of the Year Award.

TIMEFRAME OF MILESTONES

- 2017: Foundation of Love Serving Autism by Lisa Pugliese-LaCroix / Launch of the first therapeutic tennis program for individuals with autism starting with 20 participants.
- **2018**: Expansion into multiple states across the United States, reaching communities nationwide stablishment of strategic partnerships with tennis organizations, therapy centers, and community stakeholders.
- **2018 ongoing:** Successful fundraising initiatives, including the annual Match Point Gala and securing grants from philanthropic organizations.
- 2019 -ongoing: Development of innovative training programs for therapists and coaches to enhance program delivery and impact. Integration of communication device technology to support nonverbal participants during sessions.
- **2023:** Transition of Lisa Pugliese-LaCroix to full-time work at Love Serving Autism, furthering dedication and commitment to the organization's mission / Formation of a 7-member board of directors for Love Serving Autism.
- **2024:** Continued program expansion, development of coach and therapist certification, planning for inclusive INTERACT therapeutic center.




IMPACT & TRANSPARENCY

FUNDS ALLOCATION




80% of our funds directly support participant programs. This dedication ensures impactful services and opportunities that empower individuals with autism to thrive.

In 2023, we successfully allocated 80% of the \$500,000 raised funds directly to participant programs, totaling \$400,000.

FUNDS RAISED

Our commitment to fundraising remains steadfast, driving our mission forward and empowering neurodivergent individuals with autism and their families. At LSA, we employ various strategies to raise vital funds:



- Program registration fees from participants.
- Annual fundraising events, such as the Match Point Gala and charity tennis tournaments.
- Donor campaigns and appeals.
- Corporate sponsorships and partnerships.
- Grant applications and funding opportunities.
- Online fundraising platforms and crowdfunding campaigns.
- Major gifts and planned giving programs.
- Community outreach initiatives.

QUANTITATIVE PROGRESS

THERAPY IMPACT

LSA utilizes the HIPAA-compliant EMR4Kids portal for therapists to record baseline and reevaluation scores, tracking quantitative progress in Communication, Motor Coordination, Life, and Behavioral Skills. Lisa Pugliese LaCroix, LSA's Founder and Director of Programs and Clinical Services, oversees progress monitoring.

The ongoing therapeutic racquet sports sessions incur direct costs for on-court therapists and coaches:

- Coaching fees are \$60 per hour
- Therapy fees are \$80 per hour

Our highly qualified coaches and therapists, certified in their areas of expertise, play essential roles at each program site.



Our participants average 95% improvement in communication skills and motor coordination skills proven through our medical records portal, goals and data tracking, and documenting progress weekly.
