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# **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The Tubac Community Center was created in 1999 by a dedicated group of local residents with the help and support of Santa Cruz County. Built in 1964 as the community school, the Community Center now provides facilities and resources for outdoor education, social, civic and life-long learning opportunities. The Tubac Community Center Foundation (TCCF) is an all-volunteer 501 (c) (3) organization that through a County Usage Policy, has assumed the role on behalf of the County for the stewardship and management of the facility and grounds. In early 2019, the TCCF Board in partnership with the County identified the need for developing a Facility and Land Use Master Plan that would take in consideration the needs of the community, maintain a "Gathering Place" sensibility and help guide the immediate and future development of the facility and surrounding acreage. As part of the development of the plan, the Board felt strongly that it was critical to gather feedback from all of the organizations, agencies and individuals that currently utilized the Community Center. In late 2019, TCCF contracted with Ms. Lani Lott, President of L.L. Consulting to assist with the outreach and engagement process and help draft the Master Plan.

Ms. Lani Lott has over 25 years of working in the field of business development and economic revitalization and has conducted large community visioning sessions, prepared and distributed on-line surveys, facilitated small group work sessions and presented final reports to local leadership for a number of agencies in Arizona including the Arizona State Parks/Arizona State Historic Preservation Office – Arizona State Main Street, Arizona Department of Commerce – USDA Business Enterprise Grant, the International Sonoran Desert Alliance – Historic Ajo Town Site Project, the Nogales Port Authority, Nogales Community Development Corporation, the Town of Superior Community Development Plan, City of Globe, AZ – 60/70 Highway Curb Appeal Plan, and the Town of Carefree Village Master Plan.

The Community Outreach process for this project included an eight-question community-based assessment utilizing the online program SurveyMonkey®, holding a community forum, distributing an online questionnaire to all the current organizations utilizing the Center and conducting a series of Focus Group Interviews with all of the users.

The Community Assessment was designed to reach residents in Tubac, Tumacacori, and Amado and was widely distributed through both the online survey as well as posting flyers, one-on-one intake, posting in several social media platforms and through email blasts. The survey was open from October 22, 2019 to December 26, 2019 and 256 surveys were completed. The cumulative results included:

206 or the 256 survey respondents were from the 85646-zip code; 77% of respondents were year-round resident and 98% indicated they knew about the Center.

- Respondents indicated that the top five reasons for visiting the Center included visiting the Public Library (56%), attending the Santa Cruz Valley Citizens Council meeting (42%), for community events (36%), attending other organizational meetings (35%) and visiting either the Tubac Nature Center and/or the Tubac Historical Society (both 30%).
- When considering the uses typically offered at a Community Center, the five uses/activities that respondents indicated were of "high priority" of importance to them included:
  - Space for community events (44%)
  - Health & Fitness programs (43%)
  - Open Space and walking paths (40%)
  - Indoor/outdoor space for special events (39%)
  - Enrichment classes (i.e. art, music, language, computer, etc.) (37%)
- In addition to the above referenced results, there were numerous comments shared in the "Additional Comments" which can be found in the final report's appendix.

On December 10, an evening community forum was held inviting the community to bring their ideas of what they would like to see for the future development of the Tubac Community Center. About 45 individuals attended the two-hour forum and were actively engaged sharing their vision for the Center, and what they thought were the strengths, weaknesses and opportunities support that vision of the Center. (The compiled results of the Community Forum are located in the Final Plan Appendix).

A questionnaire was developed and distributed to each organization that currently uses the Center as well as held a series of focus group interviews were conducted with all of them. The objective of the questionnaire and focus group interviews was to update key information about each group, gain insight about their current needs and discuss any future plans they may have had expansion. Ms. Lott used the information shared in the questionnaire to create a master spreadsheet with each user's response as well as compiled the discussion shared at each of the focus group interviews. Both documents were then used during the all-day strategic planning session. Top priorities shared by the organizations included:

- Better organized and additional parking
- Improvement of the technology infrastructure and updated equipment
- Beautification of the grounds in front of the Center
- Better signage to and around the Center
- More storage opportunities
- Additional meeting/room space for expansion

On Wednesday, February 26, 2020, Ms. Lott returned to Tubac to conduct an all-day planning session with the TCCF Board of Directors. At the planning session, each board member received copies of the compiled results of the community assessment, community forum and the focus group discussion and

used the information to draft the Tubac Community Center Facility and Land Use Master Plan as well as set goals and objectives for expanding the capacity of the Foundation. The Master Plan includes six (6) high-level goals that are intended to serve as the long reaching strategies for the Center's Master plan, five-year objectives for supporting the goals and 2020/2021 priorities for the short term. Below are the six high-level goals, the five-year objectives and the 2020/2021 priorities\*\* as listed in the Final Plan.

# Goal 1. Continue to improve the interior of the Tubac Community Center to support the current and future needs of both the users and the community.

# **Objectives (Up to Five Years)**

- 1.1 Maintain a clean, welcoming and informational lobby
- 1.2 Continue to update/upgrade the Center's furnishings, equipment and amenities
- 1.3 Continue to work with the County and the users of the Center to assess the highest and best utilization of all rooms to support the users' current needs as well as assist with future expansion/growth plans **Goal 1: 2020/2021 Priorities** 
  - Review the Foundation's Facility and Grounds Improvement Checklist and identify top priorities for 2020
  - Develop a sponsorship plan for supporting the 2020 furnishing and equipment upgrades
  - Develop Operation Manuals for use of existing equipment (AV- projector, sound, screens)
  - Convene a meeting with the Tubac Nature Center, Santa Cruz County Valley Citizens Council and the Rotary Club regarding upgrading AV equipment
  - Meet with the Public Library leadership to discuss current and future needs
  - Meet with the Friends of the Library to discuss their mission, plan for the books in storage and current needs/plans
  - Convene a meeting with Friends of the Santa Cruz River to support/assist with identifying a solution for their storage needs and future plans.
  - Meet with Tubac Historical Society to discuss need for additional research space that is quiet, yet close to the THS room
  - Meet with the Tubac Nature Center to discuss short-term goals/expansion needs (outdoor education and more youth programs)
  - Meet with the Tubac AA Group to discuss a more appropriate space for the group (discussed possibility of sharing the room Friends of the Santa Cruz River currently occupies) which in turn could open up opportunities for expanded use of the large meeting room in the evenings and weekend.
  - Explore opportunities for TCC use of the County Public Works out building. Uses ranging from additional meeting space to short-term storage.
  - Take inventory of medical equipment and other furnishings and reduce as appropriate. (Kate Penland and Greg Guthrie)
  - After all of the above meetings, draft a matrix to compare answers and determine next steps.

# Goal 2. Enhance the curb appeal of the Tubac Community Center grounds and improve the overall parking of the Center.

# **Objectives (Up to Five Years)**

- 2.1Improve the front landscaping to make it more visually appealing
- 2.2 Develop and incrementally implement a comprehensive wayfinding signage program to help guide folks to the Center
- 2.3 Improve the current parking supply and expand parking to meet future demands

# Goal 2: 2020/2021 Priorities

- Form a task force to work with Landscape Designer who has volunteered to assist with developing a plan. Ask the County to appoint someone to serve on the Task Force
- Form a work group to design an outdoor monument sign that announces the Tubac Community Center and the key tenants; Present design, costs and timeline to Board and present to County for approval (and possible financial support)
- Coordinate and improve existing parking with the County
- Discuss with the County the possibility of using the South end of the Center grounds for future parking

# Goal 3. Continue to address/support the current and future needs of the outside users and the grounds in general.

# Objectives (Up to Five Years)

- 3.1 Work with the County to remove the softball field and develop a site plan for the area that addresses the area's limitations as well as explore what are realistic uses accordingly
- 3.2 Work with the Tubac Pickleball Association and the County with future improvements
- 3.3 Work with the County to develop a schematic and/or site plan and timeline for the south buildings and land of the Center
- 3.4 Continue to work with the Tubac Community Garden to evaluate their current needs as well as future plans and offer support when needed

## **Goal 3: 2020/2021 Priorities**

- Work with the County to assess the elevations of the softball field to start to develop the actual elevations for the area and what uses would work; TCFF to draft a policy/process for evaluating future uses of the acreage
- Strengthen the relationship between the TCCF and the Pickleball Association
- Walk the area and determine what would be TCCF's top two priorities in 2020 for either the buildings and/or the land
- Meet with County Administrator to explore the opportunities of the South area and discuss TCCF's thoughts on their top two priorities.
- Meet with the Garden Board to discuss the development of an orchard

# Goal 4. Bring the Tubac Community Center and the Foundation into the 21st Century in regards the overall management of the Center.

# **Objectives (Up to Five Years)**

- 4.1 Stabilize and continue to update the policies, procedures and operations of the Center and the Foundation
- 4.2 Develop and implement a volunteer orientation and training program for Board members and other volunteers

## Goal 4: 2020/2021 Priorities

- Work with the County to execute an updated Memorandum of Understanding/Contract
- Review and update the TCCF bylaws, vision statement and mission
- Update the Facilities Use Application and ensure that ALL users/instructors have signed it and are complying
- Continue to update TCCF policies and procedures
- Computerize the scheduling system including enabling individuals and groups to email their requests.
- Review the volunteer manual and update as needed; Recognize volunteers; Name tags

# Goal 5. Expand the image, reputation and knowledge of the Tubac Community Center Foundation and its value that it provides to the County, partners, tenants and community at large. **Objectives (Up to Five Years)**

- 5.1 Continue to strengthen and maintain an on-going relationship with the County of Santa Cruz County
- 5.2 Maintain and expand partnerships with civics or other community organizations
- 5.3 Utilize a broad range of communication and marketing tactics to share both the programs and activities offered at the Center as well as TCCF's role and volunteer opportunities

## **Goal 5: 2020/2021 Priorities**

- Present the 2020-2025 Tubac Community Center Facility and Land Use Master Plan to the County Manager and Board of Supervisors
- Twice a year provide an update to the County on the progress and accomplishments
- Invite Supervisors to tour the Center; Meet one-on-one at least once a year with the District 3 Supervisor
- Form a partnership committee to develop a plan to strengthen relationships and better communicate with partners
- Re-establish relationship with the Tubac Chamber of Commerce
- When formed, offer to serve on the Learning Center Steering Committee
- Launch TCCF website
- Strive to post more regularly on TCCF's Facebook page
- Work with Celeste Wisdom to publish the monthly Calendar of Events on the Wisdom (Restaurant) Website

# INTRODUCTION

The Tubac Community Center was created in 1999 by a dedicated group of local residents with the help and support of Santa Cruz County. Built in 1964 as the community school, the Community Center now provides facilities and resources for outdoor education, social, civic and life-long learning opportunities. The Tubac Community Center Foundation (TCCF) is an all-volunteer 501 (c) (3) organization that through a County Usage Policy, has assumed the role on behalf of the County for the stewardship and management of the facility and grounds.



Over the last twenty years the uses and expectations of the Tubac Community Center have grown as has the community from the Center's usage being relatively low key, with an emphasis on serving seniors, to an increasingly vibrant emphasis on community social, outdoor education and civic uses of all kinds. Over the last three years, the usage of the facility has tripled. TCCF is experiencing a higher volume in the number of both requests for space, as well as ideas for expanded and new uses of the grounds.

The TCCF Board in partnership with the County has identified the need for an overall coherent plan that takes into consideration the needs of the community, maintains a "Gathering Place" sensibility and helps guide the immediate and future development of the facility and surrounding acreage. As part of the development of the plan, the Board felt strongly that it was critical to gather feedback from all of the organizations, agencies and individuals that currently utilize the Community Center, as the bases for developing the five-year Master Plan. To assist with the outreach and engagement process, as well as to draft the 2020-2025 Facility and Land Use Master Plan, TCCF contracted with Ms. Lani Lott, President of L.L. Consulting, a consulting firm located in Phoenix specializing in rural community development, downtown revitalization and community outreach strategies.

Founded in 2000, L.L. Consulting has assisted state agencies, local municipalities, and non-profit organizations across Arizona providing a full range of project management services, community outreach and consensus building, business development, market analysis and economic restructuring technical assistance targeted to help agencies, communities and organizations reach their project goals and implementation objectives.

# COMMUNITY AND PARTNER OUTREACH

To assist with drafting the 2020-2025 Tubac Community Center Facility and Land Use Master Plan, Ms. Lott, with input from the TCCF Board, outlined an outreach strategy that included the following community engagement and outreach activities:

# **Tubac Community Center Assessment for the General Public**

Working with the Tubac Community Center Foundation (TCCF) Board, Ms. Lott created a simple, eight question assessment utilizing the online program SurveyMonkey®. The Board then distributed the survey utilizing a number of methods that included:

 Asking several of the program leaders/users at the Center to hand out the flyer about the survey to their members/attendees.

- Posting flyers about the survey at the Community Center, inside and outside the Tubac Post Office as well as the Tumacacori Post Office, the local gym, the Tubac Chamber of Commerce, the Tubac Market, the Tubac Deli, the Mercado/Market and Garrett's Market.
- Board members handed out the survey at the Tubac Post Office asking people to fill it out while they were there and/or complete it through the link when they were back at their personal computers.



- The Tubac Pickleball Association, the Tubac Community Garden, the Nature Center and the Tubac AA Group included reminders and the SurveyMonkey® link to their mailing lists.
- Posts about the Forum on the "Nextdoor Barrio de Tubac" App and Tubac Face Book page.
- The Vistas HOA sent the survey to their members.
- TCCF shared the information about the community engagement and master planning process during the November 2019 Santa Cruz Valley Citizen's Council meeting and distributed hard copy surveys, as well as a flyer with the link. The Council then included the information about the master planning process in their minutes and reiterated it during the December meeting as well.

The survey was open for about nine weeks from October 22, 2019, to December 26, 2019. The survey had a very large response with more than 256 completed surveys. The survey provided valuable insight about how many individuals knew about the Center, data on the programs and activities that they currently or in the past have used, ranking importance of the types of programs they would like to see offered at the Community Center and additional comments regarding the Center and Foundation in general. L.L. Consulting compiled the responses which were circulated to the TCCF Board of Directors prior to the Master Plan planning session which was held on February 26, 2020. (The compiled results of the Community Assessment are located in the Appendix for reference.)

# **Tubac Community Center Existing User Questionnaire**

As part of the outreach strategy as well as a way to assist with updating TCCF's records and create a master database of the current users, Ms. Lott, in partnership with the TCCF Board created a Survey Monkey® questionnaire. The questionnaire was specifically targeted at capturing key information about all of the Center's users as well as gain additional insight about each organization's current needs and future plans for expansion and growth. L.L. Consulting created a master spreadsheet with each user's information and provided it to the TCCF President. In turn, the general responses regarding the users current and future needs were compiled were compiled and also circulated to the TCCF Board of Directors prior to the Master planning session held on February 26, 2020. (The compiled results of the questionnaire are located in the Appendix for reference.)

# Focus Group Interviews with Key Users of the Center

On December 10 and 11, 2019, L.L. Consulting conducted a series of focus group roundtables with key members from the existing users of the Center. Over the two-days 26 people representing nine of the key user groups, each spent quality time sharing information about their organization, their current needs and future plans. Ms. Lott provided guidance to the invitees and facilitated the discussion during all of the interviews and roundtables. Members of the Board also joined a number of the group discussions. (The compiled results of the focus group interviews are located in the Appendix for reference.)

# **Community Forum**

On December 10, an evening community forum was held inviting the community to bring their ideas of what they would like to see for the future development of the Tubac Community Center. About 45 individuals attended the two-hour forum and were actively engaged sharing their vision for the Center, and what they thought were the strengths, weaknesses and opportunities support that vision of the Center. (The compiled results of the Community Forum are located in the Appendix for reference.)

# **Master Plan Planning Session**

On Wednesday, February 26, 2020, Ms. Lott returned to Tubac to conduct an all-day planning session with the TCCF Board of Directors. At the planning session, each board member received copies of the compiled results of the community assessment, community forum and the focus group discussion. After reviewing the results of the survey and focus group interviews, the Board with input from Ms. Lott, discussed the importance of a drafting a vision statement to help create a visual picture of the preferred future of the Center. Ms. Lott shared with the Board that in her opinion a strong vision statement then supports an organization mission and their goals, programs and reason for existing. Below are the ideas shared during the planning session:

- Meeting the needs of the community
  - Outdoor venue for concerts and festivals
  - Health and wellness
  - Affordable meeting space
  - o Education + research for local outdoor environment and historic preservation
  - Socialization for people to gather and share interests
  - Resource for the community
  - Meeting space for organizations to hold their meetings

After discussing the vision for the Center, the Board discussed the organization's current mission and made the following suggestions for updating the TCCF's Mission:

**Current Mission:** TCCF mission is to work through a volunteer staff to facilitate and promote leadership and coordination in providing education, social and civic activities at the Tubac Community Center for the diverse economic, ethnic, and multi-generational population of Northern Santa Cruz County, Arizona.

**Revised Mission:** TCCF mission is to work through a volunteer staff to facilitate and promote leadership and coordination in providing outdoor education, social, life-learning and civic activities at the Tubac Community Center for the diverse economic, ethnic, and multi-generational population of Northern Santa Cruz County, Arizona.

- ⇒ Consultant recommended that the TCCF Board take some time to draft a vision statement and officially adopt it to be part of the 2020-2025 Master Plan.
- ⇒ Consultant recommended that the TCCF Board review and then adopt the revised Mission Statement.

# FRAMEWORK for 2020-2025 Tubac Community Center's Facility and Land Use Master Plan

Purpose of Goals, Objectives and Priorities: After reviewing the results of the community outreach tactics, discussing the vision for the Center and revisiting the TCCF's mission statement, the remainder of the day was dedicated to working with the consultant to draft the Tubac Community Center Facility and Land Use Master Plan as well as set goals and objectives for expanding the capacity of the Foundation as the management body for the Center.

The following high-level goals serve as the long reaching strategies for the Center's Master plan. The longer-term objectives (up to five years) and 2020 priorities, individually and collectively, are intended to guide the efforts of the County, Foundation, the Center's Users and the community at large by providing a course of action that the entire community can use to allot their time and resources to the desired improvements envisioned for the Center and can strategically address growth opportunities.

It is the recommendation of the consultant that once the coronavirus pandemic is over, the Board should reconvene, take some time to review the 2020/2021 priorities and make any updates necessary to ensure that the Center is meeting any new guidelines resulting from the virus outbreak.

## Comments Regarding Outside Uses, Grounds and Improvements Needed

- More and better lighting for night events. Very poor website listing upcoming events
- Pickleball courts are great! Thanks, we contributed \$\$
- Space for an orchard full community access and enrichment. A dedicated handicap parking and egress for supplies at Community Garden.
- The County has no public Tennis Courts. There is room for at least two courts at the community Center. Very important to many people! Please.
  - I think we should consider moving the Montessori school to the community center location. They are currently renting property from the Catholic Diocese of Tucson and cannot expand to include 7th and 8th grades. This is a valuable asset for Tubac and I am interested in the school's long-term success to attract younger families to our village.
- "The Center represents the Community well in many ways. But the Center's physical appearance is not up to par.
  - Spiffing up the front and adding landscaping would help.

- The South wall of the building gives the first impression of the Center and it is a bad one. The ugly utility items could be hidden with fast growing bushes.
- There are signs on Bridge Rd pointing to the East, but when you come to the stop sign/dead end, you see nothing to the right and only an unattractive utility looking building with no readable sign to the left. A LARGE sign facing straight up Bridge Rd pointing out the center to the left is badly needed.
- The back walk and just East need cleaning and landscaping.
- Need better signage at the entrance and throughout the Center."
- "Anything that can be done to beautify the front grounds of TCC would be so-o-o appreciated.
- "Tennis would be nice addition because of the active tennis community in Tubac.
- "Landscape front, repaint pink doors!
- "Parking. Priority 1 is beautification of the front yard.
- For retirees and tourism, we need pickleball, hiking, biking etc. We do not need youth activities i.e., basketball and soccer, i.e., model Bend Oregon.
- Like to see more pickleball courts.
- "It seems the community garden and pickleball courts have been an excellent addition to the community and community center. Lots of activity in both.
- I do support various sports being available to the community, however I have not seen any softball played at all, and never more than one or two people casually shooting hoops maybe once a week. However, the pickle ball courts are used every day morning and afternoon and the Pickleball community is still growing. 4 courts won't be enough for long!
- For a number of the uses above, there are local alternatives. However, there are no local alternatives for Pickleball. This survey should have separated out pickleball from basketball, soccer and baseball as basketball, soccer and baseball fields/courts are either not used at all or only very rarely used. On the other hand, the pickleball courts are used throughout the day, 7 days per week.
- May need more pickleball courts.
- In this whole process, I think it should be taken into consideration adding a walking/biking lane on bridge road from the frontage road to the center. It's dangerous walking or biking on the road and (unfortunately) many of the people driving to the center are not respecting the 25-mph speed limit.
- Water fountain outside would be nice
- Enhance the wildlife habitat
- There are outdoor space limitations. So, is not valid to group soccer, baseball and pickleball all together as soccer and baseball fields take up significant space compared to pickleball.
- Something needs to be done about the ever-expanding roadway towards the community garden. It is getting wider and dustier. It needs to be delineated to keep it narrower. Have people walk there unless they have a disability or limit parking to 15 minutes for drop offs. No others should be driving in that direction.
