Did you ever read about the bird who held up a bank because it had no money to buy food? No? How do birds eat? Did you see the newspaper article on the trembling flower, worried that soon all its petals would be gone? No? Where does a flower get its "clothes?" What does Jesus declare will be true for people who concern themselves with whatever task God is calling them to do? (Read Matthew 6).

God grants wealth to some of His Christians-even beyond what we need to keep our bodies protected and our stomachs healthy. Some of us have more than one room to live in! Some of us have books that we own. Some of us even have more than one vehicle. More than half of the people in the world are not wealthy. That doesn't mean we're better; it means we have been given an opportunity to be generous to others. When we are generous in this way, what does God say we are doing? (read the verse from 1 Timothy).

What is this "heavenly treasure?" Someone once asked, "If you had in heaven only what you've given away, would you have enough to live on?" Maybe this treasure is a generous nature. All we know for sure is that we need not worry about our physical needs because God has promised to provide us with what we need to survive and spread the Good News.

When God give us even more than we need, we have the opportunity to share this heavenly treasure. God is so bountiful, He fills our cups to overflowing with His blessings. Every day could easily be Thanksgiving because every day we are given so much.

During this season of Thanksgiving, why not take some time with your family and try one of these activities...

God Sighting: Before you go to sleep, thank God for specific happenings in your day. When you count your blessings like this, you will be amazed at the sheer volume of God's gifts. By recounting our blessings, we become confident that God will always provide enough to spare and enough to share!

2 kernels of corn: put 2 kernels on an empty plate at your Thanksgiving table and have each person prayerfully review the past year and decide which 2 events God has given him/her.

A-Z challenge: start with blessings that start with the letter A and see how many things you can name for each letter.

Ponder: for what might you thank God that has NOT happened this year?

Thanks be to God that He who clothes the flowers and feeds the birds, takes care of us. We are even more precious to Him. Happy ThanksGIVING and Happy ThanksLIVING!

#### Leadership Retreat Recap from Sadie Duckert and Ryan Opansky

Over the weekend of October 13<sup>th</sup>-14<sup>th</sup>, the Calvary Leadership Team held its second Leadership Retreat partnering with Peace Lutheran Campus Center from UW-Stephens Point. We used a facility not far from Calvary called Upper House for the majority of Saturday.

This year we centered our Bible study around a book called "Trust and Teams" by Jane Fryar that focused on trust with God, within a congregation, and within our community. One of the main points of the book stated that a trusting relationship starts with getting to know someone well. Using this as a starting block, we reflected on how we can strengthen the trust between us and our campus community, and how this would look in action at Calvary and Peace. Making the effort to say hello on the way into worship or sitting with someone new might make newcomers feel more welcome before the service starts. # A View from the Treasurer Greg Rademacher

#### Treasurer's Report (as of September 30th)

Full financial statements are available in the church office for review. A few financial highlights through the first 9 months of the year:

- 1) Through September 30<sup>th</sup>, plate and envelope offerings are running at 85.9% of 2017's operating budget. The \$356,008 received is 0.9% ahead of last year, but that figure has declined significantly over the past two months. Increase in offerings has not been sufficient to keep pace with the higher budget that was approved for 2017. Total income is at 90.5% of budget.
- 2) Overall, expenses are running very close to budget, with total costs for the first nine months coming in at 98.5% of budget. The projected budget deficit was forecast to be \$41,045 through the first 9 months of the year, but is actually \$82,142. The \$41,100 gap would be erased if envelope offerings caught up with the budgeted amount; however, if they do not it will be difficult to include any increase in the 2018 budget.
- 3) As a reminder, the substantial "other income" and "other expense" amounts reflect the net impact of insurance settlements and repairs during the year, including both the roof and dumpster enclosure.
- 4) Cash reserves continue to decrease, although this is traditionally near the low point of the year. The savings account is just over \$50,000, which is roughly one month of cash flow. I would like to see the savings account balance at least partially replenished by year-end, with a bank balance of 6-8 weeks' expenses ideal for handling the ebbs and flows throughout the year.
