SING AND GIVE THANKS

"Sing to the Lord a new song; sing to the Lord, all the earth. Sing to the Lord, praise his name; proclaim his salvation day after day. Declare his glory among the nations, his marvelous deeds among all peoples. For great is the Lord and most worthy of praise; he is to be feared above all gods." Psalm 96:1-4

The Thanksgiving season is upon us even though it seems that some stores have been ready for Christmas for over a month! Traditionally, Thanksgiving gives us a little time to recall all the blessings which have been given to us. We do have many things to be thankful for, including our homes, our spouse and families, our jobs and friends, and many other blessings as well. As a church family, we also have so much to grateful for, especially the truth of God's Word revealing a Savior who has given us life everlasting through His own life, death, and resurrection. So much to be thankful for, indeed!

The text above, I believe, communicates that we should have thankful hearts 365 days of the year. So often Thanksgiving just comes and goes quickly and the thankful heart goes with it. That isn't what the Psalmist is relaying to the readers. We are to "sing to the Lord" daily, not just on Thanksgiving or on the Sunday mornings we are in church. Not only does the Psalmist call us to give thanks to God, but to also proclaim what He has done. We are called to tell others about the love and peace we have in knowing Jesus as our Savior. The Lord is great; He is worthy to be praised! Let us sing and speak with all our might, because His glory has made us His own.

This season is a great time for me to let you all know how much I thank God for each one of you. God has richly blessed me to be the one He has called to serve you! It is a calling that I treasure. You are all in my prayers as we continue to follow His lead in sharing His great love at this time and at this place. I ask for your prayers as well so that I may reflect Jesus in all that I do and say.

May our Thanksgiving be one of many celebrated days as Jesus leads the way!

Of particular note was the presentation in November of 2017 of our first annual Honor Quilt to Duane Neitzel in recognition of his past military service and continuing service to the church.

Thanksgiving Household Object Lesson: Thankfulness in a Box... time but throughout the year, especially when you are not We often forget to give thanks and approach God only when we want something. This object lesson is a great reminder for all of us that we can break this habit by simply using a box filled with opportunities to feel gratitude.

Fill a box with your own items and come up with at least 5 different ways you are thankful for this item. You will put yourself and your family in a position to feel thankful in ways you may have never felt before.

For example...in your box, you might include...

- An empty soda can
- An old battery
- A dirty shoelace
- A used Tupperware container

Using the old battery, perhaps these are reasons you might be thankful for this old, dead battery

- This battery may have lit something like a flashlight for a long time. Thanks God for that kind of light.
- This battery may have made an old toy move back and forth. Thanks God for ways to make little kids feel happy and have something with which to play
- Thanks God for the invention of a battery. I am grateful for inventors to whom you whispered what could be made to make life easier.
- Thank God for different brands and sizes of batteries...that means there are people who have jobs making these for others.
- This battery is outdated, but now we have rechargeable batteries which helps us charge phones and cameras. Thanks God for technology.
- Batteries come in handy for flashlights and weather radios when the electricity is out. Thanks God that you provide for us during storms.
- Our spiritual lives are a lot like batteries. We need to be recharged with God's Word and time for worship. Thanks God for helping us to recharge just like batteries so that your power is at work in us.

For each item, spend some time as a family coming up with various reasons as to how this object makes you focus on being thankful rather than resentful that it might be dirty, used up, or outdated. You will be amazed at how your attitude shifts towards being grateful and appreciative to God for the many blessings you might actually take for granted each day.

I have done this activity with kids in my Logos class and it's always fun to see how many reasons they can come up with for each object. I encourage you and your family to select some random items from around your house to fill up your box. Why not make this an activity not just at Thanksgiving

feeling so thankful or content. After all, God's goodness and love is a part of each day...spend some time realizing just how benevolent He really is to you!

- Speaking of being thankful, I wanted to extend my sincere thanks and appreciation for all of you who ordered butter braids through our preschool fundraiser. We sold a total of 211 braids and had some other monetary donations which helped us earn \$1505.00 to be used towards a new wooden cabinet and bookshelf to replace our old, worn-out ones in the classroom. - Our October compassion project consisted of writing thank you letters to different community leaders. Budget time! What does that phrase conjure up for most of you? Probably some stress, maybe some angst, but how about JOY? Now you might be thinking your Executive Director, an accountant by vocation, has lost his marbles, so let me explain. At this time of year, PPC (all Board Directors, the Executive Team and Pastors) is busy pulling together the annual budget for 2019. Each Director takes a stab at their respective section of the budget and submits it to Justin Kirchen, Director of the Board of Stewardship. He then accumulates all that information into the first draft of an overall budget and then deliberations at PPC begin. We started in October and will finalize it at our November meeting.

To further explain the process, there are two major components to any budget – the Income side and the Expense side. Income for our congregation comes primarily from your plate and envelope offerings (a smaller amount comes from facility use fees, a good portion from Preschool and then a piece from District to support Pastor Dan at Calvary). After summarizing the commitments made on Commitment Sunday (November 4th this year), Justin includes a budgeted income number that usually is a few % higher than the prior year and then we at PPC pray about what our congregation will find in their hearts to provide for the various ministries we will embark on in the coming year. We try to be realistic, but also faithfully optimistic.

The Expense side is what defines what we as a congregation can accomplish with the gifts we are given so graciously from our Lord. Beginning with salaries and benefits for staff, to missions, to education and music, we also fund programs for youth, fellowship, outreach and health and wellness. All while taking care of mortgage payments and property and building maintenance expenses. There are so many ways we use our God-given gifts to His glory.

So, JOY all around! JOY in combining all of our gifts and JOY in carrying out our many ministries through the passionate, inspired work of all our talented, active members. Therefore when you see that proposed Budget at the December Voters meeting, keep in mind all the JOY we create together in the name of our Risen Lord Jesus Christ!
