AS WE GATHER


Jesus was not always the way we picture Him. In our Gospel text today, we see Him being "punchy" with the chief priests and elders. They asked Him about where His authority came from. He tested them with a question they refused to answer. So Jesus refused to answer them. Today we rejoice that Jesus' authority, given Him by the Father, is in the forgiveness of sins in the <u>Lord's Supper</u>.

Guests: As a congregation of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, we confess the Biblical teaching that the Lord's Supper is Christ's true body and blood "through and in which we obtain the forgiveness of sins." All who intend to receive the Sacrament are encouraged to take time before the service to read the "Christian Questions with Their Answers" in the pew hymnal on Pp. 329-330 as a way of preparing to receive the Supper (1 Cor.:11-27-29).







Why will you die, O house of Israel? ³²For I have no pleasure in the death of anyone, declares the Lord GOD; so turn, and live."



Matthew 21

NICENE CREED


PROCLAMATION OF CHRIST


LORD'S PRAYER


