# **HAITI CRISIS - LETTER FROM GEORGE & SUE KRUG**

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ at Mount Olive,

You probably have not seen or heard much about the continuing turmoil in Haiti because there has been very little, if any coverage, through the standard news channels. Just this past Monday, the 11th, we saw an editorial in the Wisconsin State Journal talking about their situation but it's the first we've come upon. Sue and I, however, have been very aware of it because of a former Compassion child, Widnika, who we sponsored for many years. She graduated high school, and matriculated from the Compassion program a couple of years ago. God has enabled us to remain connected with her, and we're helping her financially to attend college and also learn English.

This "Haiti connection' has also expanded since this past winter, when in Florida we met a woman, Helen Rosenfeldt. As God sometimes leads you, we found that Helen started, and runs a very small 501c3 due to her affiliation with the Florida-Georgia LCMS church. It's called mission: Haiti. The organization is dedicated to glorifying God and transforming lives through their service to the people in Haiti by supporting opportunities focused on academic and spiritual education. Because she regularly travels to Haiti to work with the Haitian missionary leaders she made an effort to meet Widnika. Of course, we were ecstatic to have had her make this contact, but are more grateful that she now keeps us informed of what is happening in Widnika's life and home country.

Recently we received a letter from her that speaks to the extreme situation Haitians are now living in. Helen, and her small crew of Haitian cohorts, are responding to this turmoil by attempting to provide for the basic needs of so many. We told her we would be happy to share this letter with our congregation in the hopes you might consider helping Haitian people like Widnika and her family. We include an excerpt from Helen's letter to give you an idea of what they're dealing with...and what they're doing:

"The unrest, which has resulted in roadblocks, demonstrations, riots and burning, actually started more than a year ago because the president has been implicated in widespread corruption and refuses to step down. Gas, diesel and propane costs have nearly doubled, gangs wield unprecedented power, people are afraid to go to market to buy or sell, schools, banks, government offices, and hospitals are often closed or due to lack of electricity and supplies. Normal commerce is at a virtual standstill. It is no overstatement to say that people are dying because of the situation. Rampant inflation has doubled the cost of food....and most Haitians make less than \$2 a day, when they can find work!"

"Many charitable organizations have suspended or abandoned work in Haiti at a time the average person needs help the most. They can't open their feeding programs or move food in big trucks for fear of theft or violence. Several elderly ladies told our Field Director, Lophane Laurent, that they had not eaten anything for more than 2 days. Lophane used some of his own money to buy food for the ladies...Families who rely on school lunches to feed their children, can't send their kids to school and can't afford food because they can't go to work since roads are blocked or people are afraid they will get caught on the wrong side of a demonstration. Lophane has a friend who owns a food warehouse and he can supply food to Lophane in amounts that Lophane can carry discreetly in our small pickup truck. He can get food to the elderly, single parent families and those he knows are the most nutritionally vulnerable, if we can pay for it. Thirty dollars will buy enough rice, oil, canned fish, spaghetti, (and also soap) to feed 1 person 2 meals a day for 2 weeks."
