*“As Jesus went on from there, two blind men followed him, calling out, ‘Have mercy on us, Son of David!’ When (Jesus) had gone outdoors, the blind men came to him, and he asked them, ‘Do you believe that I am able to do this?’ ‘Yes Lord,’ they replied. Then Jesus touched their eyes and said, ‘According to your faith it will be done to you’; and their sight was restored.” -Matthew 9:27-30*

As you probably know by now, the Department of Public Health – Madison & Dane County deemed religious entities as essential, allowing worship spaces of 50,000 sq ft or less to congregate at 25% capacity (up to 60 people for Mount Olive). When the Bible says "do not lean on your own understanding," the Bible is being serious. Your heart is deceitful, your emotions fluctuate, your understanding does not see the overall, big picture. God never lies, God never changes, God knows all. Trust Him.

People often ask me, "What is Proverbs 3:5-6" because they see it tattooed on my arm. And without any thought, I usually just recite it off the top of my dome like the Pledge of Allegiance, but rarely considering whether or not I am allegiant to that pledge. I

think so many times we take familiar Bible verses just as words to be recited -- and not life and truth to be received. We use them when convenient and rehearsed, missing the power behind the words. I'm guilty of this myself and I can't even count how many times I have recited my "life verse" without contemplating the profoundly solid and practical truths in such a verse.

*"Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding, in all your ways acknowledge Him and He will direct your paths" (Proverbs 3: 5-6).*

Let's contemplate the words "trust in the Lord." You see, when we trust in something, we are placing our security in that entity. For example, I absolutely trust my earthly father, which means I have total and complete confidence in his integrity, ability, and good character because I know him and have a relationship with him. I trust in him because I know he will do what's best for me. However, is that the same level of trust I am placing in my Heavenly Father?

If I am being honest, I would admit that it is harder to trust God than it is man, even though man will always let us down. Only God is perfectly trustworthy and faithful. Yet if I do not take time to get to know Him, I will never come to trust Him. "Trust in the Lord with all your heart" means placing our heart at the Lord's feet. This surrender leaves no room for our own anxiety or worry, but completely entrusts our "being" to God's sovereignty. And as crazy as that may sound or even as scary as it may be, the next part of this verse is necessary for the "trusting" to lead to "His holding."

You see, to "lean not on your own understanding" is to lean completely into the strong arms of God's holding. It means to not rely on ourselves, essentially letting go of what we think we know and letting God take the helm of what He perfectly knows.

*"In all your ways acknowledge Him"*: not some ways or some days, but always with all our ways. This means to admit the existence, reality, and trustworthiness of God. To acknowledge Him as Lord over our world and to give Him full access to sit on the throne of our hearts. There and only there can He begin to govern our walk.

*"And He will direct your paths."* He will begin to establish our steps and lead us where He needs us.

With all that being said and explained, I don't want to just be able to recite God's Word, I want to be incited by God's Word. I don't want to just quote it verbally, I want my life to quote the Truth of God's Word visually. It begins with trust and ends with Him. Trusting Him. Period.

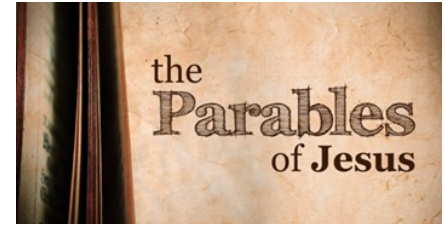
## A VIEW FROM THE FAMILY LIFE DIRECTOR Rev. Mark Baldwin

## A VIEW FROM THE TREASURER Greg Rademacher

A few financial highlights from the first four months of fiscal 2020:

1. Overall, Mount Olive remains on solid financial footing and has been navigating the Covid-19 shutdown admirably. It is safe to say offerings have exceeded any expectations that leadership had back in mid-March when in-person worship was suspended. Thank you for your faithful support!
2. Through April 30th, envelope and plate offerings of \$147,330 were at 87.2% of budget and were down 6.6% year over year. These figures represent a continued decline from the prior month, but remain a rather encouraging figure all things considered. The first half of May saw the year-over-year deficit shrink to 2.1% thanks to the receipt of a one-time stock gift.
3. Expenses continue to run below budget, at 85.7% through April 30<sup>th</sup>. That figure also represents a decrease of 9.5% over the first four months of 2019. Primary sources of savings have been lower support to District (budgeted decrease), no asset management transfers (budgeted decrease), lower staff benefits (budgeted decrease) and youth/property expenses (likely temporary timing factors).
4. The current net loss of \$23,612 is ahead of the forecasted budget deficit of \$26,676 as of April 30th, although it did increase by about \$4,300 during April. This loss is offset by the \$6,000 grant we received ("other income"), but for reporting purposes I am focusing on the operating loss.
5. Reiterating the message from last month, we are noticing a decline in offerings but not of a magnitude that would create short-term financial stress. There is an increase in the usage of PushPay and online giving. If you have recently made a gift using PushPay for the first time, we'd appreciate any feedback you have regarding the giving experience.
6. Thankfully, we continue to have sufficient cash reserves to manage monthly cash flow. The timeframe noted last month has not changed meaningfully with the passage of another month, so we would now expect to be able to cover expenses through the end of July without any offerings coming in, or through October at a reduced level. While worship services will resume, we do not yet know what attendance/offerings will look like, and will therefore continue to track reserves using these cautious assumptions.
7. We are expecting to receive the second installment from the District's school grant prior to the end of May, which should add \$7,500 to help with cash flow.

## A VIEW FROM THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE

Funding from the district will still be available for this year as well. The Committee's focus throughout the remainder of this year will be enrollment efforts, and hiring a teacher/administrator.
