"As Jesus went on from there, two blind men followed him, calling out, 'Have mercy on us, Son of David!' When (Jesus) had gone outdoors, the blind men came to him, and he asked them, 'Do you believe that I am able to do this?' 'Yes Lord,' they replied. Then Jesus touched their eyes and said, 'According to your faith it will be done to you'; and their sight was restored." Matthew 9:27-30

We live in a world that doesn't seem to trust a whole lot anymore. Why should we? Our culture has proven time and time again that few, if any, are to be trusted when it comes to our lives and the relationships we have surrounding us. With that in mind, many get involved in friendships and marriages already expecting to see it dissolve because, as they say, "that's just the way it is today." It's easy to see why trust is at an all time low when you look around.

#### Thank God for Jesus!

Jesus came to our broken world to redeem us and to let us know that there is someone whom we can trust. Please reread the text above. The two blind men, in faith, believed that Jesus was the Son of God and able to heal them. They trusted that Jesus could do something out of the ordinary, to make people see. Even though their lives were far from perfect, they looked for mercy instead of cursing at Jesus for their hard life. What did they receive? The gift of sight. Now you may not see any similarities to your own lives, but they are there. At the center of this text is the question of trust. Jesus asked, "Do you believe that I am able to do this?" He asks us the same question today. Do you believe that I am able to comfort you at the loss of a loved one? Do you believe that I am able to restore your relationship that seems to be headed for separation or divorce? Do you believe I am able to give you the strength to stop this addiction? Do you believe that I am able to save you? These are tough questions, yet Jesus has an answer for these and all the other questions that face us daily. "Yes, I am able."

This brings me to an important question. Do you trust Him? Do you trust that Jesus is who He says He is and that He has done what He says He has done? If yes, and I pray it is for all of you, are you willing to trust Him with your lives? Trusting someone makes us vulnerable to them, but we needn't worry when it comes to trusting Jesus. He came because He loved us and wanted us to live eternally with Him. He is able to bring peace to our lives. He is able to give us balance as we live in this untrusting world. Trust Him in this! He is able!

God give you the strength to believe that, in all things, Jesus is able.

# A VIEW FROM THE PRESCHOOL

I've been reading through a book called Why Pray? by John F. DeVries. The author's intention is to read a chapter a day, discovering that prayer is indeed a powerful privilege of faith. Prayer transcends our words, and in so, it becomes part of a satisfying relationship with God..

Knowing what we are in Christ helps us to gain an even deeper and intimate relationship with God as we pray to Him. We are just more than sinners saved by grace! That statement itself is powerful and yet, we are MORE than that. 2 Corinthians 5:17 states..."Therefore if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come!"

One of Satan's tools of lies is for you to believe that you are merely a sinner, saved by grace. He doesn't want you to read the verse from above, because that totally changes things for His game plan. We are not simply being remodeled...God creates a new life within us! 


# A VIEW FROM THE FAMILY LIFE DIRECTOR Rev. Mark Baldwin

# A VIEW FROM THE TREASURER

### Treasurer's Report (as of March 31, 2019)

A few financial highlights from the first quarter of fiscal 2019:

- 1. Through March 31<sup>st</sup>, envelope and plate offerings were only at 81.9% of budget and were down 15.3% from last year. While winter weather was poor and there was a one-time gift from 2018 that skewed the numbers, it is a trend that we will monitor in the coming months.
- 2. Expenses were at 95.4% of budget through the first two months, although a significant contributor is the fact that contribution to the health savings accounts are paid early in the year. Board directors are paying close attention to any categories that are running ahead of schedule.
- 3. Cash on hand has been declining due to the combination of lower receipts and higher expenses, but reserves are sufficient to handle short-term liquidity needs. However, the reduction is something we will also be monitored closely throughout the year.
- 4. Full financials for the first quarter of 2019 will be available in the office. You may also request an electronic copy by e-mailing Greg (treasurer@molconline.org) or Derek (chuch office@molconline.org).
- 5. Our mortgage is an adjustable rate, with the next reset occurring in September. Should mortgage rates drop significantly between now and then, we will potentially raise the issue of moving ahead sooner to lock in the interest rate. The congregation can also explore re-financing with a different lender (such as LCEF); we are likely to explore all options to secure the most attractive terms for Mount Olive's loan.
- 6. Overall, the impact of the new tax law is still unknown, but we have seen a general increase in "planned gifts" IRA distributions, stock gifts, and bunching of gifts on an every-other year cycle. While these approaches don't necessary impact the annual giving figures, they are making comparative statements less informative depending on when these gifts are received. We will continue to watch the monthly figures, but want to avoid drawing any big conclusions from them and will put greater emphasis on the longer-term (quarterly and/or annual) trends.


