

Our small group bible study decided a couple months ago that the book of Revelation would be our next topic of discussion. Little did we know then how a virus would interrupt our lives and our study together. One thing we have learned is that we can "see" each other by means of technology. We have also found that the words we are studying have an even deeper meaning as we contemplate the current church amid these times and our future lives in context of the world around us. The text above was introduced during our last study. It is a text that I have loved for a long time. I even had it penned in calligraphy on my office wall while I served as pastor in Braidwood because it was, and still is, one of my "driving" verses for my faith and life. Be faithful unto death. Powerful words, indeed. Yet how can we faithful? To whom are we faithful? These are questions that been asked over the ages.

Well, we start with the One who has been faithful to us. Our God is faithful. He is faithful in loving us. He is faithful to His word in saving us through the blood of Jesus Christ. In this faithfulness, He calls us to be faithful. Faithful to His word. Faithful to His commands. Faithful in following Him every day, in any season of life. This can be quite difficult as we are not perfect people who can automatically follow as we are instructed. We get distracted by, as Scripture states, "other gospels" that do not lead us to Christ, but away from Him. These "other gospels" are open to or following the ways and directions of the culture which do not believe in the true God or believe that the scriptures are from God. These "other gospels" sometimes slip into the Christian church. When that happens, the Bible becomes more like a buffet line with people picking what parts of scripture they like to fit their lifestyle or system of beliefs. Part of being faithful means recognizing that our minds are going to stray from His truth, being willing to repent of our tendency to follow our own way or the way of others who misrepresent His truth, and ready to follow His way even if it costs us our lives.

This is a tall task, but remember, this is not something that we bear by ourselves. Our God is faithful. Our God is actively moving to remind us of His love. He is with us every step of the way. He has been faithful so that we can be faithful. He has loved us so that we can love one another. He has shown us grace so that we can be gracious to others. And during this time of anxiety and uncertainty, God continues to grant all of these things to us. What comfort it is to know that God has us safe and secure in His saving arms during this life. He has overcome the world so that we could have peace.

These are difficult times, times I pray will never be experienced again, but they are not the end. It is well with our soul because God continues to be faithful. May we be faithful in response so that God can live through us as we lift up, build up, serve, and love one another.

A VIEW FROM THE TREASURER

A few financial highlights from the first quarter of fiscal 2020:

- 1. Through March 31st, envelope and plate offerings of \$108,762 were at 89.4% of budget and were up 2.8% year over year. These figures are off from the February report, as March offerings were down 6.8% (about \$2,900) from 2019. Still, a rather encouraging figure all things considered.
- 2. Expenses continue to run below budget; however, a couple of timing differences are expected to bring total expenses much closer to 100% of budget by the April 30th report.
- 3. The current net loss of \$19,353 is ahead of the forecasted budget deficit of \$24,976 through the first quarter, but will likely shift to running behind projections once the added expenses mentioned above hit.
- 4. While early April indications are that we will almost certainly be running behind last year, estimates are that we are still running at 90%+ of last year's offerings through April 30th in spite of no in-person gatherings for 6 weeks. We are noticing a decline but not of a magnitude that would create short-term financial stress.
- 5. Thankfully, we continue to have sufficient cash reserves to manage monthly cash flow. As of March 31st, total cash in the bank was just over \$166,000. Given an average monthly outflow of roughly \$50,000, we have a little over 3 months of expenses covered without any offerings coming in. That would bring us until the middle of June. If our March/April experience is indicative, we could expect to see monthly offerings of \$20,000-\$30,000, extending that timeframe to six months (end of September) and hopefully well beyond the end date for any coronavirus precautions.
- 6. We are expecting to receive the first two installments from the District's school grant prior to the end of May, which should total \$15,000 and help with cash flow. (The first installment was in fact received and deposited in mid-April.)
- 7. The Finance Committee will discuss whether it is appropriate to pursue an equity line of credit or consider a cash-out mort-gage refinancing given the decline in mortgage rates and the potential impact to cash flow. We have also applied for a loan through the Payroll Protection Program, which could bring in as much as \$65,000 if fully approved. The loan would be forgiven as long as we continued at full staff through June 30th, so this is more of a grant application than a loan.

8. The 2020 Annual Report was published in February, which included a categorical breakdown of membership giving. Figures remained relatively stable when compared to prior years; copies are available upon request if members didn't catch the report initially.
