Just a friendly reminder to let us know if you are hospitalized. The hospitals used to let us know if any of our members are hospitalized, but unfortunately, that is no longer the case.




BOOK CLUB

A VIEW FROM THE BOARD OF ELDERS Curt Casanova

2020 has been a year of challenges. Whether it be this pandemic, personal health issues, national events, or job situations, it is difficult because for the most part we have no control over these. One thing though we do have control over however, is our faith in our heavenly Father. The board of Elders would like to continue to urge your faithful participation in the Word and Sacrament, either via online or in person. We especially want to invite those members taking part in the virtual service to take advantage of the opportunity to participate in communion with Pastor Jason or Pastor Mark. This can be done privately at Mount Olive, or Pastor Jason or Pastor Mark can even come to your house (or lawn). Just contact Luke in the church office to make an appointment, as the opportunities are there. As Martin Luther reminds us in the Large Catechism,

“For this reason we go to the Sacrament because there we receive such a treasure by and which we obtain forgiveness of sins. Why so? Because the words stand here and give us this; for on this account He bids me eat and drink, that it may be my own and may benefit me, as a sure pledge and token, yea, the very same treasure that is appointed for me against my sins, death, and every calamity.”

To that purpose, we want to assure you that we are constantly monitoring our services here to bring us in concordance with our local health recommendations. We can provide masks, we consistently wipe down the pews after each service, and are instituting additional cleaning measures in our classrooms. We have emphasized proper social distancing for seating during worship. And we have altered our communion practice to protect our congregation and servers. (Special thanks to Dave Gaston for inventing a wafer distribution device which avoids direct handling of the bread). May our Lord give you peace during this time. May we all continue to seek out and put our faith in our Lord Jesus Christ.

“Give thanks in all circumstances, for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.” 1 Thessalonians 5:18

There are some of us who love words. I’d much rather play a game like Scrabble or Boggle than spend my time trying to solve a Sudoku challenge. Don’t get me wrong, math has its place, but I find it fascinating that certain words can take on so much meaning, especially those 2 or 3 letter words known as prepositions. One may not think that they are significant, but they can certainly frame the context of an entire thought or sentence.

Case in point? The Bible verse from 1 Thessalonians where Paul states we are to give thanks **IN** all circumstances. Did you notice that tiny little word? It may not seem that remarkable, but what if you were to exchange the word “**In**” with “**For**?” What would be the difference in the meaning of this Bible verse?

Certainly, when hardships are a part of our daily struggle, it may be difficult to have a reasonable thought of thankfulness. We don’t enjoy hard days, broken relationships, financial strains, or the thought that COVID may affect us or a loved one. God grieves over these things and He holds the tears of sadness, despair, and pain in His very hands. So then how are we to give thanks? Are we to be thankful **FOR** poor choices, consequences of our shattered world, and daily difficulties? Notice, the word Paul is instructed to write....**IN** all circumstances! What a stark contrast that 2 letter word embodies. When we give thanks **IN** all circumstances, we are in fact, reminding ourselves that our hearts of faith in God is bigger than the difficulties. He can use those very circumstances for His good and glory. That is a huge difference! (Tony Evans quote).

God’s will for us is ordained by His good and gracious heart...He wants our lives to flow with thanksgiving because He knows that when we are grateful, the enemy is stopped from trying to convince us otherwise. We do not lack His blessings of love, mercy, forgiveness, presence, and complete assurance of eternal life. Wallowing in ungratefulness and focusing on the hardships robs us of these blessings. Giving thanks **in** all circumstances is not easy, and by the world’s standards, seems ridiculous. But, when we truly spend time counting our blessings even in the middle of struggles, we are witnessing to those around us that God is the one who directs and rules over our lives. We can choose to be joyful and thankful because His Spirit is at work in our hearts.

The saying, when “life gives you lemons, make lemonade” is undeniably a nugget of wisdom held in esteem by many. But let us as His chosen and beloved children, instead proclaim 1 Thessalonians 5:18! There is always joy in Him and because of His presence, we can truly be thankful **IN** all circumstances. And for those of us that are known wordsmiths, we give thanks for those little words known as prepositions...**IN** is not the same as **FOR**!


Sunday February 7th 3:00 PM- *Every Praise*: Olive Branch leads all in a spectacular concert of contemporary favorites as they do every Sunday!
