\square Organization's Constitution or Bylaws (must outline mission, structure, and purpose)
2. Organizational Information
☐ Summary of the NGO's mission, goals, and main activities
\square List of governing board members and their roles
☐ Proof of a democratic decision-making process
3. Financials & Activities
\square The two most recent annual reports, including activity summaries
$\hfill\square$ Audited or signed financial statements for the past two years
\square Funding sources and a description of how funds are managed
