01. Celebrating Women Who Tell Stories

Storytelling traditions span time and cultures and have been relied upon for generations to both entertain and educate. She shared the importance of never giving up, questioning conventional paradigms, and disrupting the social norms that define women as inferior; this includes, discrimination, disregard, control, oppression, exploitation, and violence of women.

O2. Making your money work for you (Financial Resilience).

Ms. Bain talked about how to make money work. She said making money work entails taking charge of one's money and steadily using that power to increase one's stability and security and eventually, be able to achieve financial independence or amass riches through investing. Reminding us to set goals to help stay focus on what matters most, build an emergency fund, understand where money goes, reduce, or eliminate debt and build up one's knowledge.

03. Self-care through skincare.

Ms. Evans stated that self-care is the decision-making process in which women use information to look after their own health. With no sole specified way to practice self-care the most important is to put yourself first and that you need your own time. She left us with 3 immediate things to Care for yourself: know our skin type, start a regimen, and give it time as you allow our skin to tell our story!

04. Your voice is your spirit. Be the change of resilience for tomorrow's story tellers (Injecting Positivity).

Ms. Johnson inspired the women in the room, to be their own chair leaders and to always move with positive people. They were encouraged to never procrastinate because it will stagnate their growth and they must always show their true potential. She gave examples of simple steps using her journey to tell her story as a reason it is important to believe in oneself.
