



Page 1

- Agree to the privacy policy.
- Enter, then reenter your social security number.
- Last/Family Name
 - This needs to be your legal last name. This needs to match what is on your transcript/test scores...if it doesn't there will be problems matching your transcript to your application. If there is a space or a hyphen, please use the correct one.
- First Name
 - Use your correct first name, not a shortened version or nickname
- Middle Name
 - o Enter it if you have one

If you used a different name on the SAT/ACT you can enter it here. If you are unsure as to if you did or not, log into your College Board Account or ACT Account and check, please!!

 - Should be a parent or guardian



Apply Texas How to start a new application



You need to select application type, US Freshman, Fall 2022 If you do not see Fall 2022, then they aren't open yet. PLEASE be careful with this!!



You will typically enter a first and second choice major. Then you will choose your deadline.

• A&M's deadline is 12/1/2021—yes with engineering they want you to apply early, but that's not an "official deadline" so you can't choose it. Choose the 12/1/2021 and if you are trying to get your application in by 10/15/21, then just get your stuff in. There isn't a way to indicate that on this application.

Every college's application could be slightly different because they are allowed to ask their own questions, so make sure to look at each question.

Be prepared to answer the following;

- Highest level of education for each of your parents (if you don't know, that's ok. If you only have one parent, that's ok.)
- Were you ever in foster care (this is important—ask your parents if you don't know)
- If you speak another language, choose it!
- The family's gross income is just trying to get some information...this is NOT the FAFSA/TASFA but your answer should be accurate.
- How many people are in your household...include siblings in college.
- If you have other obligations (work/babysitting, family health, etc) that limited your extra curriculuar experience responsibility PLEASE indicate that!!! It will open up other questions. This is a new, very important question!!

- Transcript shared with Community College-Yes if you've taken DC, Not applicable if you haven't

Senior year course information

you must list all courses including:

Athletics, Office Aide, Late Arrival, Early Release, lab management*

Our courses are divided into semesters You can make courses 1st/2nd or both.

Make sure that you are including all the things that are relevant to your major, and all the things that you have done. For example, if you are an engineering major, make sure to put in anything and everything related to that. But if you are also in band, and aren't a music major, you need to enter that as well!! They tell you to list them in priority order...that priority is up to you...it's not about time spent, it's about telling them what is important for you!

Extra Curricular Activities, Community Service, Honors/Awards, & Employment

Each of these is a separate section

you can predict/project through your senior year

you have to complete this, you can not just send in a resume!!!

Hours per week—don't let this freak you out, they are just trying to see what your level of time was. But, understand that hours per week include: practice, performance, travel time etc.
