We had just had a major parish meeting at which we assessed seriously whether we could continue on another year or more without a rector. At that meeting we made a decision to continue on as Trinity Parish and to be as strong and vibrant a

Outreach to Local, Regional and Worldwide Communities

BOOT PARTY - This annual event serves the needs of 600 homeless and disenfranchised people in Greater Hartford. This year it's being held on December 8 at Christ Church Cathedral in Hartford. Guests will receive foot care, socks, new sturdy boots and personal care packages. Trinity has been collecting personal care packages for this event. We currently have 13 care packages and \$150 in donations so that we can buy items for additional care packages. Thank you for your ongoing generosity! ANNUAL CHRISTMAS GIFT PROGRAM - Sundays, December 2 and December 9. Trinity Parish has provided toys and gift cards to children in the Greater Hartford area for many years. We will take these gifts to South Park Inn and to Wethersfield Social Services so that those less fortunate will have a joyous holiday season. There are nine boys and three girls (ages 3-14) staying at South Park Inn. On either Sunday, please bring new, safe, nonviolent and unwrapped toys with gift cards and place them around the Baptismal Font. Suggestions include books, games, dolls, cars, trucks, stuffed animals, and gift cards for teenagers. The teens in Wethersfield like gift cards from Kohl's, TJ Maxx, Marshalls, Target, Walmart, and Amazon. They should be in smaller denominations (no more than \$25). FRIENDLY SHOPPER AND FRIENDLY VISITOR PROGRAMS - Wethersfield Social Services coordinates and supervises the Friendly Shopper and Friendly Visitor programs which serve homebound seniors. Friendly Shoppers do grocery shopping for those who need assistance and Friendly Visitors provide social contact and a friendly face to visit on a regular basis. This is a wonderful opportunity to help Wethersfield residents who are housebound. This program does require a time commitment, but two people can sign up as a team and take turns shopping and visiting. WETHERSFIELD FOOD BANK - The Hunger Action Team has notified us that one out of every five people in Wethersfield are hungry. Canned pasta, rice, cans of chunk chicken, jelly (plastic cans or bottles), peanut butter, tuna in water, cans of fruit in 100% juice, low sodium soups, pasta sauce, no-salt-added canned vegetables, granola bars, fresh produce, cereal, toilet paper, personal hygiene products (soap, shampoo, toothpaste).

SOUTH PARK INN - Please place donations for this Hartford shelter in the box in the Parish Hall. Always needed are women's undergarments (tops and bottoms, all sizes), foot powder, toothbrushes, toothpaste, lotions, spray deodorant, feminine hygiene products, diapers, laundry soap, cleaning supplies, towels, pillow cases, twin flat and fitted sheets.

SYRIAN FAMILY IN WETHERSFIELD - Thank you for your generosity in providing food and supplies. They now need only the following items: paper towels, laundry detergent, dish detergent, liquid hand soap, queen size sheets and pillow cases.


