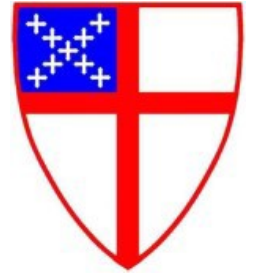

**JOY, HOPE, GIVE**

*“May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit, you may abound in hope.”*

Romans 15: 13

Dear Friends in Christ,

Every year, in the fall months, we church leaders begin planning for the next year. Specifically, we plan for the financial health and viability of the parish community. And even more specifically, we ask our fellow church members to join us in making a commitment to support the church in the coming year. Usually, we call this stewardship. We are stewards (caretakers and overseers) of the material blessings God has given us and we use our resources to support the ministry of the church.

This year, our stewardship theme is **Joy, Hope, Give**. As the scripture verse above indicates, **Joy** and **Hope** are gifts from God. What we **Give** is our response to God’s gifts to us. And we are asking everyone to think about these three words in this stewardship season.

**Joy** Ask yourself: “How has God given me Joy in my relationship with God and through my participation in the Trinity community of faith?” Maybe it’s the Joy of knowing, deep in your soul, that God loves you with an everlasting love. Maybe it’s the joy of being strengthened by the prayers of your brothers and sisters in Christ here at Trinity. Maybe it’s the joy of serving in some ministry that brings you closer to people in need and closer to God. Maybe it’s the joy of experiencing the transcendent mystery of God in the worship services and Bible studies. Maybe it’s the joy of knowing that you belong and are valued as a child of God by others in this community of faith. There are many ways of experiencing the Joy that God gives us. What is your way? How has God touched your heart? How has God given you joy?

**Hope** Ask yourself: “What is my most fervent hope for Trinity?” What good thing do I hope will come to pass in our community of faith in the coming year? Maybe you hope that we will reach out to more people in our community. Maybe you hope that we can expand our outreach efforts to hurting people, both locally and

around the world. Maybe you hope that you will find a ministry in which you can lend your own talents and gifts to the greater good of our community. Maybe you hope that you will grow deeper in your understanding of God. Maybe you hope to grow deeper in your love and imitation of Jesus, our Lord and Savior. There are many ways that God inspires hope in our lives. How has God inspired hope in you?

**Give** Ask yourself: "What will I give back to God in gratitude for the joy God has given me?" What will I give to invest in the hope that God has given me?" Saint Paul says, *"I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind."* Romans 12:1

When we consider what God has done for us, the only appropriate response is to give back to God sacrificially. That's what it means to be a "living sacrifice." When we ask Jesus to come and make his home in our hearts and souls and lives, His presence changes us. That's what it means to experience the "renewal of our minds." We begin to think and act and live like Jesus. Because he lives in us. What exactly does this mean in my life and your life? How can I give my time, my talents and my material treasure (money) to say thank you to God for all that God has given me? How can I present my own life as a living sacrifice to God? How can I demonstrate the love of Jesus through my giving of myself for the sake of others?

I am going to be thinking about **Joy, Hope, Give**. I invite all of you to join me in this season of reflection.

### **THANKSGIVING FOOD DRIVE**
