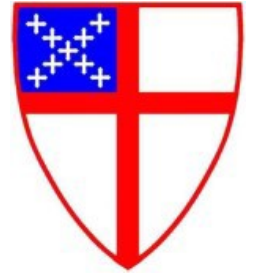

**STEWARDSHIP 2018**

Each year we have a stewardship drive in the fall. Sometimes it's very complex and we spend a lot of time on it and other years it's pretty simple. The goal is usually to raise our level of giving but more importantly to come to a better understanding of the importance of sacrificial giving in our spiritual lives.

We plan to have a stewardship campaign this year also and hope that, in that process, each of us will prayerfully consider his or her level of giving.

We are in a somewhat different situation this year than we have been in the past few years. For the first time in a number of years, we expect that in 2018 we will be able to pay our bills from the income we receive without drawing any funds from our endowment.

That's great news. But if we increase our giving, it is valid to ask the question, "What will these additional funds be used for?" Do we have a vision for Trinity stewardship?

There are so many things we could do.

We could spend extra funds on Trinity itself. For example, we could increase the hours that we offer a missional priest from the minimum of 10 to 12 to something closer to the maximum 19 hours a week. Or we could help fund some of the optional capital projects such as air conditioning in the Bishop Seabury Room. Or we could use it to make our parish kitchen more usable for feeding the hungry in our community.

We could use extra funds outside our parish. We could, for example, fund a full university education for several students in Nigeria or participate in one of the initiatives that provide clean water and farming supplies to poor rural areas.

There is so much we could do. What is your vision for Trinity's stewardship?

As part of our stewardship campaign we are planning to hold an all-parish meeting to envision stewardship at Trinity. This will take place on October 28 in the Parish Hall after the Sunday morning service. Please mark your calendar and plan to attend.

## **CHRISTIAN FORMATION: OPPORTUNITIES FOR SPIRITUAL GROWTH**

**Exploring the Parables** - You may think you know all about the Parables since you've been hearing them since church school but exploring them together brings an entirely new dimension and depth to our understanding. Tuesday evenings at 7, September 11 through November 27, Bishop Seabury Room.

**Bible Study** - Our faithful group of attendees and anyone new who would like to join will continue studying the Scriptures. Thursday mornings at 10:30 in the Bishop Seabury Room.

**Growing in Grace: An Exploration of Our Faith for Confirmation, Reception, Reaffirmation and Renewal** will begin in September as a course for adults and teenagers who wish to be confirmed or received into the Episcopal Church, and any member who wishes to renew and reaffirm their own understanding of their faith. We will meet on the third Sunday of each month after the worship service. Just grab a cup of coffee and gather in the Bishop Seabury Room for an hour of teaching and discussion time. At the end of each teaching session, we will break up into smaller groups for discussion and prayer. Teen members will have their own discussion group with their adult mentors.

The classes will be led by Father Tom Furrer and Bishop Gordon Scruton who are both very excited to be teaching. They hope that many of us will join them in learning more about the great adventure of following, loving and serving Jesus.

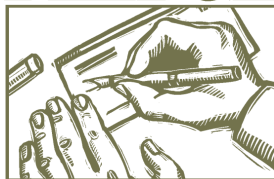

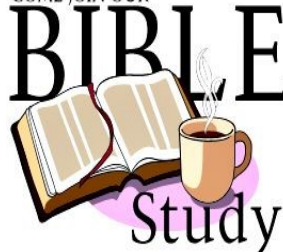
## MORNING PRAYER



## **OUTREACH COMMITTEE REPORT – LOCAL/REGIONAL/WORLDWIDE**

**Nigerian School Children Collection** Thanks to so many of you who took part in this great opportunity to send 40 orphan children to school in Bishop Marcus Dogo's Kafanchan Diocese of Nigeria. Your response was amazing! The money will be wired to him before the school year begins. The total amount collected is \$2,000. The Holy Spirit is at work at Trinity!

**CHILI & RICE & BEANS COOK-OFF** September 30 at 5:00 pm in the Parish Hall. Please join us and the community in this event that has taken on “a life of its own” for the last 11 years. For the second year St. James, Glastonbury is participating with Trinity. So far 17 people from the combined churches are cooking, and the recipes are evenly divided between the two categories. This year we have some new cooks along with many of the faithful group that have done this since the beginning. Some dishes are spicy but many are not. The food is served in 2 oz. taster cups so that you can try whatever foods you wish and go back for more of your favorites. There are two competitions – a Judged and a People's Choice for each category. You are urged to vote for the latter. This year we are adding a Popular Choice – 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> prizes for whichever of the above two categories get the most votes. Pay at the door cost is \$10 for adults, \$3 for children (ages 3 to 12), and \$25 for a family of 5 or more (2 adults only). The profit this year goes to Hands on Hartford which both Trinity and St. James support. Our parishioners have been wonderful in helping the Outreach Committee provide desserts, water, and soda for this event. A sign-up sheet is on the table in the back of the church for this purpose, and this year there will be a column for corn bread since that was so popular in Glastonbury last year.

**Wethersfield Food Bank** The Food Bank is currently in need of the following items: rice, pasta sauce, tuna, canned soups, canned pasta, canned chicken, jelly, peanut butter, snack foods. Thank you!

**South Park Inn** Please continue to place donations for this Hartford shelter in the box in the Parish Hall. Always needed are toothbrushes, toothpaste, lotions, spray deodorant, feminine hygiene products, diapers, laundry soap, cleaning supplies, towels, pillow cases, twin flat and fitted sheets.

**Syrian Family in Wethersfield** There is a basket in the Parish Hall for the family we are helping, and they are so grateful for the items and gift cards you have donated. A recent delivery was made of the paper goods (paper towels, toilet paper, tissues, cleaning detergent). Personal care items such as toothbrushes, tooth paste, shampoo, conditioner, hand soap (bar and/or liquid) along with household cleaning supplies such as Windex, Mister Clean, bleach, and laundry detergent are always needed.
