



OUTREACH COMMITTEE REPORT – LOCAL/REGIONAL/WORLDWIDE - MARILYN FORD

Teddy Bears & Friends - 3 bags of stuffed animals were delivered to the Connecticut Children's Medical Center. Thanks to all who contributed. They were much appreciated.

Visit of Bishop Marcus and his wife, Nana. The Outreach Committee was pleased to present a check for \$1,550 to Bishop Marcus and Fr. Tom Furrer to go toward medical supplies for the newest hospital in Gidan Waya. Many of you attended the reception held for them in June.

St. Vincent's Center for Children with Disabilities. We were also pleased to send a check for \$1,550 to St. Vincent's to be used where it is most needed. The school has hired an "impactful School Principal" and has begun the process of transforming education in Haiti. They have changed their name by incorporating all the entities such as "Friends of St. Vincent's" and "Children's Medical Mission of Haiti" into St. Vincent's Center for Children with Disabilities.

Syrian Family in Wethersfield. We continue to visit and work with this wonderful family who are being as independent as possible. Rose and I joined them for a delicious dinner at their home. Two air conditioners have been delivered to them - one Warren delivered (found in church garage) and the other was donated and delivered by a family member. A bin has been set up in the Parish Hall marked "Syrian Family" with the items they can use. Erin Flinn, our North Central Region Missionary told us that serving refugees is a deeply needed mission, and we are one of eight churches in our District doing so.

Wethersfield Food Bank. The Wethersfield Food Bank is currently in need of the following items: peanut butter, baked beans, canned chicken, black beans, kidney beans, and garbanzo beans. The following items are the staples that are always needed: canned pasta, rice, cans of chunk chicken, jelly (plastic cans or bottles), peanut butter, tuna in water, cans of fruit (100% juice or water), unsweetened applesauce, low sodium soups (480mg or less sodium), canned tomatoes (no salt added), tomato sauce (low sodium), spaghetti sauce (low sodium), canned vegetables (no salt added), granola bars, fresh produce, cereal. Thanks to Anne Tranberg for delivering these items to Wethersfield Social Services.

South Park Inn – Please continue to place donations for this Hartford shelter in the box in the Parish Hall. Thanks to Rose and Ray Riley who periodically deliver them to South Park Inn. Always needed are toothbrushes, toothpaste, lotions spray deodorant, feminine hygiene products, diapers, laundry soap, cleaning supplies, towels, pillow cases, twin flat and fitted sheets.

Chili, Rice & Bean Cook-off – September 30. Some of our newer members have asked about this event coming up which will be our eleventh year and second with St. James' Episcopal Church, Glastonbury. It will be held at 5:00 p.m. in our Parish Hall. It is a fun evening that has "taken on a life of its own". Please save the date and join us. We hope to once again have a good crowd to support all the participating cooks who come with great recipes and serve the food in taster cups. It would be great to have a few more people making Rice & Beans recipes since we have a good number of Chili people, and St. James' last year did only Chili. We still want our Chili cooks to return but need to balance. There are two competitions – a Judged and People's Choice for each category. More details will be in the August and September Belfry. The profit goes to an organization in the mission field (local, regional or worldwide) decided upon jointly with St. James'. Both Bishop Marcus and Nana were well received. What we take for granted, electricity, water, food, liveable wages are non-existent in that part of the world. Many from Trinity were able to attend and after their talk we had a reception with lots of good food.
