Refugee Resettlement Update

With great joy, we will be receiving a refugee family from Syria on Saturday, September 3. We don't have a wealth of information yet, but we do know that we'll be helping to resettle a family of five — mom, dad, and three teenage boys. They've been waiting to come to the United States for seven years.

Our coalition of four churches has quickly reorganized and has been busy securing interpreters, buying mattresses, shopping for perishable food items, organizing the family's first dinner, and putting the finishing touches on their apartment. Over the next month, other volunteers will help the family get medical assessments, enroll the children in school, teach them about public transportation, enroll the adults in ESOL classes, help the adults secure employment, assist in applying for benefits, etc.

As we move forward, please keep the family and our coalition of churches and all of our volunteers in your daily prayers.

Safe Church Training

Safe Church Training is offered by the Episcopal Church in Connecticut (ECCT) and focuses on the protection of children and youth as well as the protection of vulnerable adults. There are a variety of parishioners who are required to take Safe Church Training including wardens, vestry members, volunteers of the refugee resettlement team, and lay eucharistic visitors. The training program includes an online course followed by a 3-hour live session on Zoom that builds on and puts into practice content from the online course. 
"What in the world am I going to do?", might be the wrong question to ask in the face of all that is happening today. Perhaps these questions will give us better answers:
