

Advent - Waiting for Jesus

Dear Trinity Community,

Advent is a time of prayerful anticipation. Jesus came once in history, at the first Christmas when he was born. Each year, we **remember** that wonderful moment when God became one with us in the human life of Jesus.

Advent is also a time to **reimagine** our lives in light of the truth of Christmas. In and through Jesus, God came to share our humanity. In and through Jesus, God makes a home in our hearts and lives through a living faith. How am I going to live my short and fragile life with the knowledge that God has taken up his dwelling in my soul? How will the people around me see Jesus's love working through me?




