Dear Trinity Parish Community,

The coalition is moving forward to resettle a family in the next month or two.

And lastly, we are moving toward Lent. And hopefully moving toward better Covid metrics with a return to something like "normal" in terms of in-person Lenten fellowship opportunities. We are praying and thinking about the best way to meet together in the coming weeks and months.


