for a better year ahead. Being a congenital optimist, I am always looking for the sunshine. So, without reservation, I wish you all a blessed and healthy and happy year ahead!

On the other hand, we all need to recognize that the challenges we face arising from the COVID plague and its many unhappy consequences will not magically disappear on January 1, 2021. There is a light at the end of the tunnel in the form of two or more viable vaccines that hopefully will allow us to move toward something approximating normal life again. But there are many unknowns about the efficacy of the vaccines, not to mention the political, economic, social and tribal disruptions that will arise from real or imagined inequities in the distribution of them. While the year ahead shows promise of improvement, it also has many serious challenges in store for us.

And this is where the words of the prophet Isaiah (quoted above) are relevant. The words were written about 2,500 years ago in the midst of a great national calamity for the people of Israel. The prophet says that, in tough times, even the most energetic and vigorous people will fall flat from exhaustion. But those who gain their strength from God — who rely on the strength and inspiration and perseverance from trusting God — will rise to the challenges and overcome them.

Even youths shall faint and be weary, and young men shall fall exhausted; but they who wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength, they shall mount up with wings as eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint.

Why is that so? Because God is the inexhaustible source of strength. No matter how much optimism, strength and perseverance a person has, we all reach our limits. When we wait upon the Lord, we draw on an infinite source of energy and strength.

Have you not known? Have you not heard? The Lord is an everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He does not faint or grow weary, his understanding is unsearchable. He gives power to the faint, and to him who has no strength, he increases strength.

My hope and prayer and New Year's wish for all of us is that we can learn to wait upon the Lord and renew our strength and "rise up with wings like eagles" to meet the challenges of this coming year. And may our church community be a shining light of the world-changing love of Jesus in the midst of all of the people we meet amidst the trials that are ahead.



Holiday Hallmarks


