Here we are in a new year. Let's hope and pray that God has a good purpose for us in the coming year and that we can find out what it is and open our hearts and minds and lives to embrace the life that God intends for each one of us.

As we look at the month of January, we have a couple of special opportunities to grow deeper in our faith and life.

First, we have the Alpha program beginning on Monday, January 24. This course has been used by thousands of churches and experienced by millions of people all over the world, including the two churches of which I was the pastor for nearly 30 years. It is a good opportunity to grow deeper in your faith and in your relationship and friendships with others.

Resettling A Refugee Family

"They who assist others nearby are good neighbors, Ah but they who display compassion and fellowship to strangers across the seas are True Citizens of the World." Sir Francis Bacon

We have joined with First Church in Wethersfield, St. Andrew's in Rocky Hill and United Church of Christ in Newington to form an independent non-profit organization called Citizens of the World. Our mission is to resettle a refugee family in one of our communities. The family will probably be refugees or "humanitarian parolees" from Afghanistan and they will have been living on military bases since the Taliban takeover.

In addition to establishing our non-profit entity, we are preparing for our family in a variety of ways. Donna Brown is Trinity's Team Leader and she is coordinating our volunteers with regard to communications, training and special projects. She also meets regularly with the other three team leaders for Citizens of the World. One of our key activities right now is finding an affordable 3- or 4-bedroom apartment that's accessible to public transportation. Trinity and our partner churches are researching the towns of Newington, Wethersfield and Rocky Hill. We'll join with St. Andrew's in Rocky Hill for a ten-week program to discuss our Christian faith and to explore how we can grow deeper in faith and service to God.


