We want to thank you all from the bottom of our hearts for the wonderful send-off you gave us on our last Sunday at Trinity. We were deeply grateful for the many kind words and other expressions of love and appreciation that you extended to us that day.

We both have so many wonderful memories of our 4+ years with you and we continue to hold you in our daily prayers, confident that "the One who began a good work in you, will bring it to completion" in the new season that you are now in. God is good—all the time. And God will continue to lead and guide you into the next chapter of your pilgrimage.

We have spent the last four weeks unpacking boxes and trying to adjust to our new life here in Ohio. Sadly, about two weeks after we arrived here, my sister's husband died unexpectedly of a heart attack. So we have spent most of our time preparing for his funeral and helping my sister and her family grieve the shocking loss. We have been worshipping at the "small but mighty" Grace Episcopal Church where my Dad has been a member for many years. The congregation has a lot of similarities with Trinity in Wethersfield and they were a great help to us as we held my brother-in-law's funeral and reception at the church.

We miss you all very much and we hold you all constantly in our prayers and we love you all dearly.


