Obituary

Elnora Bonton, 86, was born Elnora Tibbs on April 13, 1935, in Morrow, Louisiana. She passed away on Wednesday, February 23, 2022, in Houston, Texas.

Elnora was a servant of our Lord Jesus Christ, wife, mother, grandmother, sister and aunt. Elnora was the fifth child of seven born to Tom Tibbs and Leola (Johnson) Tibbs.

Elnora accepted Christ while growing up in Morrow, Louisiana at the Little Rock Baptist Church. She was joyful in hope, patient in tribulation and faithful in prayer.

Elnora married her loving husband and friend, Pierre Bonton, Jr., on September 26, 1953 and four children were born to this union. The Bonton family moved to Port Arthur, Texas where Elnora was a resident for over 60 years. During her husband's life, Elnora served beside him as Deaconess, Baptist Training Union Leader and Choir member. After his death in 2006, Elnora became an active member in Women's Ministry and Sunday School at Eastern Star Baptist Church.

Elnora worked at Jim Carr Motors and with other private employers as a domestic and caregiver for the elderly. Her priority, however, was creating a comfortable and peaceful home for her family and bringing joy to her large extended family with her excellent cooking and loving hospitality. Her industrious spirit, determination and organized administration served as an example to her children and grandchildren as they gained confidence and excelled in educational and career pursuits.

Elnora moved to Richmond, Texas in 2015, due to failing health. She continued her faith walk with the Lilly Grove Missionary Baptist Church, Houston Texas. She loved listening to great preaching and praising the goodness of God.

Elnora's prayer was "Lord, add years to my life and life to my years." She and her husband loved to travel and were blessed through vacations and joyful family celebrations with their children. Elnora's courageous spirit and witty humor added laughter and fun to her relationships with family and friends. Elnora's quiet wisdom and loving spirit will truly be missed while her legacy will never be forgotten.

Elnora was preceded in death by her parents, Tom and Leola Tibbs, her husband of 53 years, Pierre Bonton, Jr., her siblings, Tom Tibbs, Jr., Carrie Lee Barzar, Marvin Tibbs, Enix Tibbs and daughter, Lois Bonton Ponder.
