Obituary

Frances Yvonne George

Frances Yvonne George, 76, of Port Arthur, Tx transitioned to her heavenly home while residing during a short stay at Harbor Hospice located Beaumont. TX.

Frances was born to Leola Washington and Samuel Pleasant in Monroe, LA and she received all of her formal education in the public-school system and graduated from Carroll High School in 1963. Frances made the decision to enlist into the Woman's Army Corps. In her military career, in which Frances reached the ranking of an E-5, she met Mr. Charles E George and they were married on July 10, 1966. She was honorably discharged from the Woman's Army Corp to begin her life with her husband and during their blessed union of marriage four children were born.

Mr. & Mrs. George decided on New Hope Missionary Baptist as their church home in which, she was a Sunday school teacher of the nursery class. Frances was a homemaker until, she decided to go back into the workforce in 1996. Frances was a note taker for disabled students at Lamar University and she took on a variety of subjects, but her absolute favorite was welding. She also was a crossing guard for Woodrow Wilson Middle School until 2004. She was an active member of her final church home, Eastern Star Baptist church, where she served on the deaconess board. She also was extremely pivotal in organizing programs that recognized church members that were veterans and pioneers in the civil rights movement.

Frances was preceded in death by her parents, sister Beather Douglas, sons Donald C. George and Edward T. George, and granddaughter Arianna L. George.

She leaves to cherish her passing her husband of 55 years, Charles E. George, children: Charles L. George (Kathleen), Patricia Y. George, Erika L. George (Joseph Como, Jr.) and Cynthia Rahming; A daughter - in - law Lori George; A devoted sister, Minnie Neal (William); brother- in- law Eugene George; Eleven grandchildren, seven great-grandchildren and a host of relatives and close family friends.
