





























Rev. Ronnie A. E. Crockett, Sr.

Pastor: I will, and I ask God to help me.

Leader: Will you lead these people of God in giving faithful witness to the Word and making known the love of God through loving service both in the congregation and in this community?

Pastor: I will, and I ask God to Help me.

Leader: May Almighty God, who has given you the will to do these things, give you the power of his Spirit so that you may perform them with strength and compassion.

1 Timothy 2:1-4 (KJV)

I exhort therefore, first of all, that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and giving of thanks, be made for all men; for kings and all that are in authority; that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty. For this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Savior, who will have all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth.

We have elected Rev. Thompson to be our Pastor/Teacher at Eastern Star Baptist Church. (See Ephesians 4:11) He is not a hireling who will flee at the sign of trouble. (See John 10:12-13) He is not a doormat for you to wipe your feet on when you disagree with him. Neither is he the main course or "pot-roast" for Sunday lunch after church. He has been called by God and recognized by us the congregation, to be our under-shepherd. Let us make it a wonderful journey of joy and not sorrow in his being our pastor. (See Hebrews 13:17) After all, he has a high calling from God to lead and love us; and an even greater accountability for his service here to our Savior in the day he stands before Christ.

So, then, what are our responsibilities? What will we do in making it a joyful time here for Rev. Thompson and his family? We have a three-fold purpose in supporting our new Pastor.

First, the most important task we have as a church body is to PRAY daily, for Rev. Thompson, his family, and our church staff. Satan is having a field day destroying the lives and ministry of Pastors and their families. Our Pastor and his family live in a glass house. They need our prayers.

Let's pray for Rev. Thompson and Pam on a daily basis asking God to give him wisdom and to protect them both as they faithfully serve our Savior.

Second, we must be PATIENT with Rev. Thompson. The church is made up of sick and defective people who seek the Great Physician. Let us believe that he will faithfully preach God's Word and love us as God's under-shepherd. It may take time for us to appreciate his leadership, his humor and his faithfulness to God.

Let's pray for Rev. Thompson and Pam and be patient as he leads lost and broken people to our risen Savior.

And finally, we must PARTICIPATE alongside our pastor. He cannot do it alone. We did not call him to do our job. We did not call him to do our ministry. We called him to pray for us, to equip us and to lead us in carrying out the Great Commission given to all believers. Our faithful participation does two things. First, it reveals our support of the Pastor, the Pulpit Committee and the direction God is leading Eastern Star. Second, it's both an affirmation and encouragement to our new pastor that we recognize that God is in this calling.

Let us trust God that Pastor Thompson will seek God's direction for Eastern Star Baptist Church and that he will be faithful in his responsibilities. It may not be what is best for us or him but it will be what is best for the Kingdom of God; and it will glorify God the Father and our Lord Jesus Christ. It will be God Who, through Pastor Thompson, will inspire and instill a new vision for Eastern Star Baptist Church to follow. As he leads us toward even greater days than its past glory, let's be active participants in following Christ. We were not created to be spectators but contestants in running the race to obtain the prize, which is an imperishable crown. (See 1 Corinthians 9:24-25)

So, a challenge is set before us! Are we ready to act upon this challenge? Let's promise to pray for, be patient and participate with Pastor Thompson by following his example for the glory of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.
