Evangelist Jim W. Moss was born in Pine Bluff, Arkansas and called to preach at the age of 14. As a teenager, he preached 77 revivals in various states. At the age of 18, he became pastor of the Macedonia Baptist Church in Humnoke, Arkansas. In 1978 and 1979, Macedonia was the fastest growing church in Arkansas with over 250 baptisms recorded. God moved him to Shelbyville, Texas in 1981, where he pastored Ephesus Baptist Church until the year 1990. Then he became pastor of the First Baptist Church located in San Augustine, Texas for the next 10 years. Both churches received recognition for the largest percentage Sunday School growth and twenty percent Baptist increase. In 2000, Brother Moss surrendered to the call of evangelism. For the past 16 years, he has been in full-time service, preaching over 50 meetings per year. At the outset, he acknowledged that accountability was of utmost importance to God and the people who supported him, thus, his Love Worth Sharing Evangelistic Ministries became incorporated. He graduated and received a Bachelor of Arts Degree from Louisiana Baptist University. In December 2015, Jim was awarded a prestigious honorary Doctor of Ministry from Temple Baptist Seminary for his 41 years of dedication to the Gospel Ministry.

## Reverend Delbert E. Mack Sr. Cathedral of Faith, Senior Pastor Beaumont, TX

Rev. Delbert Allen Mack, Sr. was born in Hearne, Texas, to Rev. Oliver W. Mack, Sr. and Sis. Vina Ella Mack. He has one brother, Rev. Oliver Deon, and four sisters, Vineta, Naomi, Roslyn, and Mabris. He is the grandson of the late Bro. Arthur Mack and Rev. and Sis. R.M. Blocker.

By the age of six, Pastor Mack was a member of his father's church. After being inspired by a speech entitled "Be Real", at a youth convention in Houston, the young nine-year-old decided to accept Jesus as his Savior. Realizing his call to preach at twelve, and assisted by the spiritual leadership of his father, he began speaking at churches.

Pastor Mack began his studies at the University of Houston and Houston Baptist University where he studied Sociology and Christianity. Later he attended Lamar University where he completed his Bachelor's degree in Fine Arts. Pastor Mack has also received certifications in Theology from the Interdenominational Theological Center (an extension of Morehouse College in Atlanta, GA) and from the International Institute of Faith Based Counseling.

At nineteen, Pastor Mack began preaching in Hearne, and six months later accepted the pastorship at Mt. Tabor Baptist Church in Gause, Texas. He served as pastor from October 1978 to February 1981. In March 1981, he relocated to Houston, to become the Assistant Pastor of New Faith Baptist Church, where he served for eight years. While attending New Faith's Pastor's Banquet, Pastor Mack was blessed by meeting Alpha Denise Materre, whom he later exchanged vows of holy matrimony. To this union they were blessed with two children, Delbert Allen, Jr. and Alyncia Denise. Pastor and Sis. Mack continues to serve as role models for their children and grandchildren, Farah and Josiah.

Pastor Mack served as the Pastor of Fifth Ward Missionary Baptist Church of Houston, Texas from September 3, 1989, until he was called to Cathedral of Faith Baptist Church in January of 1994. Pastor Mack is currently pursuing his Doctor in Ministry Degree from Memphis Theological Seminary.

He was ordained as a Minister in April 1984 at Blueridge Baptist Church of Houston by Rev. Doctor Wilson Duke Richardson. He is a former student of Mt. Hope Biblical College, Houston, Texas and American Baptist College-Nashville, Tennessee-Southeast Extension. He continues his education through a multitude of courses and seminars. 
