Student Eligibility

- Be a newly accepted MSU Denver High School Student
- Graduate from a Denver Public High School or a graduate from selected Rural Districts
- Agree to participate and engage in the Summer Transition Program

Steps to Join

1. Apply and be admitted to MSU Denver
2. Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or CASFA (this application replaces MSU Denver's DAIA application)
3. Turn in all required admission documentation
4. Complete the Pathways to Possible student information form
5. Attend a New Student Orientation
