








### **Swimmer's Club Social Event**

Max Wainwright finished 3rd in the 50 Breast Senior final, Max PB'd on the 100 Breast in the heat 1.06.92 - but unfortunately got DQ'd in the final.

Ethan Walker won his Age Group 400 IM and finished 2nd in his age on 200 Back (good PB 2.14.42) and also finished 2nd on the 200 Fly.

### Club Champs Rescheduled - November

We swam the first two galas of the rescheduled Club Champs in November with the distance races. Many good PB's and some well inside County and Regional times, unfortunately as the pool is in yards the Champs are not licensed. The most noticeable swims were the record times from the Girls on the 1650 Free off Emma Masterson, Charlotte Brooks, Brogan Milward, Lily Jinks and Also from the Boys on 800 Free Max Mottram and Fin Spooner. Some of the times compared to one year before were big PB's by over 4 minutes. Emma Masterson had PB's at the Club Champs in 2021 by 30 seconds and then said I don't feel well - Emma was confirmed with Covid the next day. Emma's performance in 2022 was another PB by around 30 seconds.




#### Leeds Meet - 50 Metre Pool

Pip, Craig and Steve for giving their support poolside.








